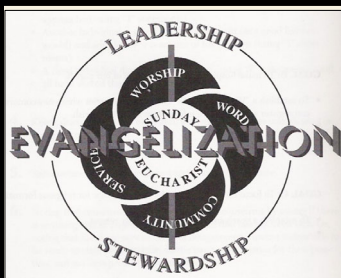

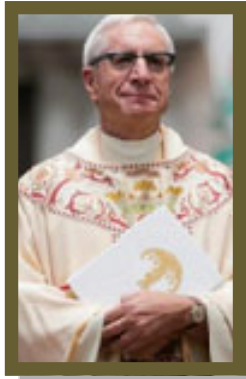

A MESSAGE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.



The second lesson usually doesn't get much attention. The first reading, generally from the Old Testament and the gospel have a coordinated theme. It's common that the homily is a reflection from the Gospel. The second lesson is part of a pastoral letter; the reading simply marches along week after week; letter, chapter, and verse. There is always something worth pondering in the second reading; most of the time it goes without comment.

Today, the letter of James which is a moral exhortation, tells us to "show no partiality". The Letter to the Hebrews 13.2 which is another letter of practical faith says: "Do not neglect to show hospitality, for by that means some have entertained angels without knowing." Do you invite the school mate who eats alone, the other employee who is without a friend at lunch, the neighbor who might smell your pasta gravy as it cooks for hours but has no one to share a table to eat with you? Do you welcome only the known familiar but neglect the new Johnny-come-lately? Each is human with the same basic needs. All of us need welcome, shelter, food, human comfort, and empathy. Thin the sauce, add more pasta, and invite someone to join your table. My Mom did, a great way to be remembered.

Last week I wrote about the virtue of integrity, this week consider the virtue of hospitality. At the request of the Angel, Blessed Mary welcomed Jesus as her child. At the birth of the Savior, the Holy Family needed care from others; "there was no place for them." In the lesson of Martha and Mary, Martha is preparing the meal which is necessary for hospitality. Mary is listening to the guest, another element of hospitality. A different kind of hospitality is taught when Jesus simply invites himself to the house of the tax collector Zacchaeus! Hospitality is the theme of the multiplication of bread and fish; "We won't send these folks away hungry. Let's feed them!" The Good Samaritan gave hospitality to the man "left for dead." The Last Supper is a meal shared, hospitality offered, and a command given: "As I have done for you, so you shall do for others." Finally, at the end of St. Luke's Gospel on the road to Emmaus, Jesus, the stranger, is given hospitality. Jesus told the disciples his story, they welcomed him, shared food with him, and their eyes were opened.

The God of the Last Judgment punishes "the rich man" for ignoring the one in need. Hospitality is the virtue of giving human attentiveness to every person, without partiality in our community. "I was hungry and you gave me food, thirsty and you gave me water, without clothing and you gave me something to wear." All of that can be outside of and away from me; I don't really have to encounter this other person. There is a different kind, a hands-on hospitality of encounter: "I was a stranger, I came from somewhere else and you welcomed me into your home. I didn't talk your language yet you engaged me into conversation. You made sure I wasn't alone."

Not much is more degrading than to be ignored and conclude that you are unwanted. Solitary confinement is harsh punishment.

Hospitality should not be done as a duty. Practice hospitality and receive the reward of the virtue. As God has been attentive to us, so should we be attentive to the other.

It's incorrect to call ourselves a community if we don't perfect the virtue of hospitality. Don't be Bashful or Grumpy. Invite Doc, Sneezzy, and Sleepy, into your home. I bet they'll leave Happy! And you will be Happy too! Dopey feels left out! Poor Dopey, receive him without partiality. He's an angel in disguise! And you thought he was "just another dwarf!"

PENNIES FROM HEAVEN REPORT

Congratulations! Wow! Wonderful! And GOD BLESS YOU! St. Juliana's parishioners are the best! We had a record collection this year of \$7,024.98. Last year around 50 parishes in the Orange Diocese participated in Pennies From Heaven and the total collection came to \$243,000.00. This money gets distributed to the 3 Life Centers, 6 Medical Clinics and 4 Homes in the Orange Diocese that provide assistance to women in crisis pregnancies. In our own area, the La Habra Life Center, that St. Juliana's Respect Life Group has been supporting with Fund Raisers for 40 years, will be moving shortly into a new, larger facility at 860 E. La Habra Blvd. They will then be an operating Medical Clinic with an Ultrasound Machine and a Medical Director. This has been the 40 year dream come true of Mecki Grothers, the founder..

There are still 125 baby bottles that have not been returned. If you intend to keep them during the year to fill them, that is fine. Otherwise please return the bottles by next weekend, so we can get the storage bins out of the vestibule.
