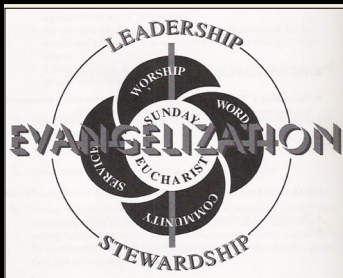

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

At many health clubs, January is usually “body building month.” Actually that’s not quite right, the body building time began with Thanksgiving and continued through “the holidays.” January is body sculpting month when many people rid themselves of the body they have built. Body builders have excited us from Jack LaLanne to Arnold Schwarzenegger.

“The holidays” have ended, we are back to “ordinary time” (sounds nearly liturgical), and a lot of people ask: “Can I make my body look good? Can I get everything in its right place and shed what is not needed? Let’s start with a physical checkup.”

The problem is what begins in January, most often ends in January! The winner is the health club, required fees were paid. The loser is the one began with good intentions but did not have the discipline to continue the good that was started. However, the biggest loser might be the one who does not even know the need for a re-built body.

St. Paul was also interested in building a body. Today’s second reading is the “Body Theology” of St. Paul. Each Sunday the first reading and the gospel passage relate to each other. The second reading is a programmed selection from the other New Testament writings. I wish to give some attention to the second reading.

Each Sunday we gather as the Body of Christ to celebrate what God has done and what he continues to do. But He can’t do it alone. He needs each of the baptized to function together as the human body does. The body has many important parts, each part doing its specific function. Otherwise, there is sickness.

By the grace of your baptism, you are part of the Body of Christ. How do you know your part? What is your function? Everyone is an important part of the community called Church; there is no member who is unworthy, insignificant, or a nobody. A lot of nobodies rise to significance by God choosing them; consider Noah, Moses, the wee kid David, Mary the Mother of God, or Peter. Some members might be under-developed or out of shape, but not un-needed or not necessary or worse - worthless.

Throughout our whole life, we have two questions before us: “Who am I? and How do I fit in?” Who am I? St. Paul is telling us that we are baptized into the “one body.” How do I fit in? Prayer and discernment answers that; for “God has so constructed the body so that there be no division in the body.” Pray and discern what gift God has given to you. This gift is given to you for the good of the Church. Then have the courage to develop your special part.

The “gifts” are also called charisms. Simply, a charism is a special grace. We don’t hide our gifts, rather we develop them. We don’t keep them to ourselves, rather we share or even spend them, with the community. The gift is not hidden “under a bushel basket”, it is spent in love to build a community. It’s your contribution to advance the whole group to God.

This weekend we gather for the St. Juliana Gala. In it we celebrate the life of Fr. Luke as a member of the Body of Christ at St. Juliana, as a member of the Servite Order, and as a dear friend. The gift of his life has advanced this community, the Servite Friars, and his friends to holiness. As an apostle, he has been sent. He has taught, healed, and been an administrator. WOW! What began many years ago continues with charm, aplomb even. May God bless him with good health and great happiness for many years!



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION - THE 3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

As Roman Catholics, our marriage practices have their pedigree in ancient Rome. One of the major players in shaping our practices was the warfare involved in building an empire. Soldiers vanished and sometimes never returned. Women began to manage their lives and to make decisions. The old family values were replaced by patriotic ones, and religion was more attuned to the gore and glory of battle, a religion of the state, not of the family. Weddings were still family celebrations, but had a public face. The bride wore a white toga and a red veil and walked to her new home. There, she and her husband joined their right hands and gave consent to each other, not relying on her father to give consent for her. Religion was optional: a pagan priest might be invited or not, and even without the ceremony, society agreed by common law that a year of living together equaled marriage consent. By the same token, marriage by consent also meant divorce was on the same legal footing, and did not require the courts or civil declarations. This is the world-view the first Christians inherited, and it was up to them to determine what was good and to hold marriage up to the light of the gospel.

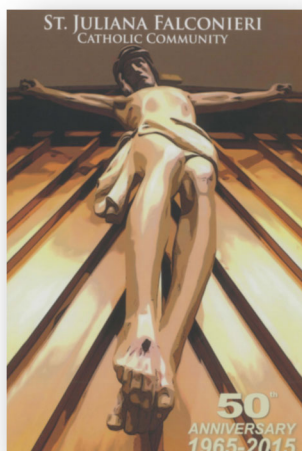

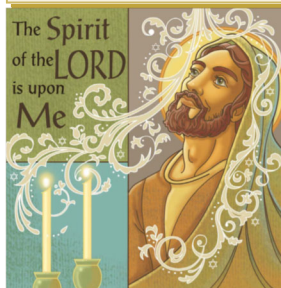

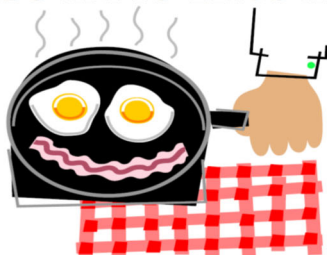

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER AND AWARENESS AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING

February 8, 2016

Pope Francis has called the Catholic community to engage in the fight against Human Trafficking. Human Trafficking is the 2nd largest and fastest growing illegal enterprise in Southern California. However, given that it is growing faster than drug Trafficking, it could become the largest illegal enterprise in a few short years with our children being the main target for sex trafficking. Labor trafficking is an even greater problem worldwide, and persists in local neighborhoods, households, businesses and industries. February 8th is the feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita who was kidnapped and sold into slavery in the late 1800's. On her feast day the Catholic community is asked to pray and take action in the fight against Human Trafficking.

Three actions that we can take that will make a difference are:

1. Pray for the healing of the victims and that God will change the heart of the Traffickers.
2. Protect the most likely victims. The most likely victims of Human Trafficking are foster children, homeless youth, the poor and immigrants. For that reason we can consider becoming foster parents and mentors. We can also volunteer for Catholic Charities, which is the largest charity in the U.S. with a focus on taking care of the poor and immigrants.
3. Make sure that for any purchase of imported products like tea, coffee and sugar, those products are marked "fair trade" meaning no slave labor was used in the growing, manufacturing and distribution of that product.

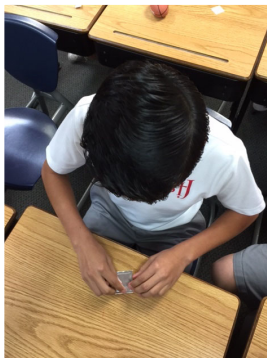

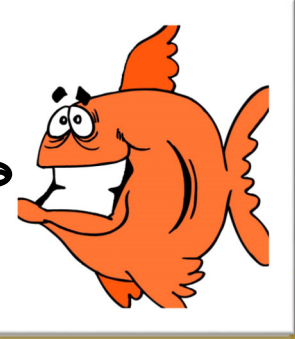

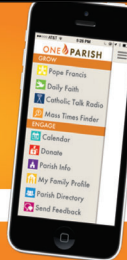
