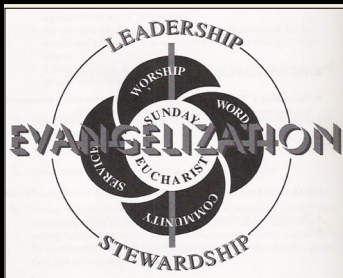

Today's second reading, I Cor. 12:31-13:13, is used often at weddings. I've heard it at funerals. It's on posters. It's a familiar reading, people like to hear it. This poetic passage mentions "excellence" and describes "love." Let's understand and practice both excellence and love.

Most organizations claim excellence. Nearly every time an anniversary year comes along so a common slogan: "Acme Plumbing celebrating 60 years of excellence." Psst: Acme connotes perfection! Yet Yelp posts several instances of good work and times when an "excellent" plumber was expected and a "Bubba" exacerbated the problem and left complaining of his tools. (It's a poor plumber who complains of his tools!)

Love is a mis-used and a not-so-well understood word. Tina Turner, that tired singer, got it all wrong in her best-selling whine:

"A boy meeting girl
 Opposites attract
 It's physical
 Only logical
 You must try to ignore
 That it means more than that
 Oh what's love got to do
 Got to do with it?
 What's love but a second-hand emotion?
 What's love got to do
 Got to do with it?
 Who needs a heart when a heart can be broken?
 It may seem to you
 That I'm acting confused"

Yes, you are confused. In fact you are wrong. Love is not an emotion, it isn't a feeling. Put those childish notions aside at once, now and forever more. Love clicks in when feelings fail.

Both excellence and love are acts of the will. Excellence is a decision made to be the best. Love is a decision to be like this: "patient, kind, not jealous, not inflated, not rude, not quick-tempered" ...and the rest of those more excellent ways.

Each morning *The Los Angeles Times* greets me with a cartoon block: "Love is...." Let's give the theme a try....

Love is ... The gift of our life. Firstly, we are the children of our parents' love, not their dreams! All that feeding, soothing, cleaning, and those sleepless nights came from a decision made out of love. Parents' dreams of the child were shattered early on in the life of that new-born. It takes love to continue to give that despotic adolescence consideration let alone life.

Love is ... The Sacramental Grace of Baptism. Out of love, parents obeyed the command of Jesus to "Make disciples of all nations." They wanted the promise of Jesus: "Know that I am with you always, until the end of the world" (Matt. 28, 18-20) to be with their child. Infant baptism is a choice, is the choice, your parents made that you would be "enlightened by Christ. Adult baptism and confirmation are clearly choices to turn to Jesus for the Good News of Salvation.

Love is ... Making disciples through Catholic education. Parents make a decision to sacrifice their time and money to educate children in our faith. In the broad sense, whether it is the Roman Catholic school system — a gift of our faith community to this country — or the Faith Formation program in a Roman Catholic parish, part of religious conversion is learning the faith. One has to know, in an intellectual way, the Truths of the faith for conversion. The other parts of conversion are affective (a place in your heart and mood), and making choices for action which is moral conversion. Know our faith, show it in your heart, and do it with deeds.

Love is... Making a friend with Jesus. All of our friends are chosen. Do you spend enough time with Our Friend? Do you visit the Lord on the First Tuesday of each month, the day our parish sets aside for Exposition of the Holy Eucharist?

Excellence and Love is ... Making a decision to be an engaged member in this faith community. Pray, Worship, Learn, Serve, Live your faith in the Risen Lord in this community in a still more excellent way.

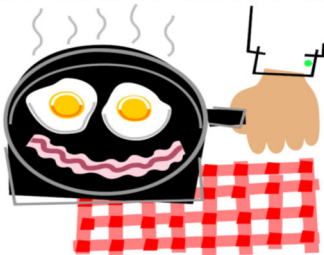

**INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER AND AWARENESS
 AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING**

February 8, 2016

Pope Francis has called the Catholic community to engage in the fight against Human Trafficking. Human Trafficking is the 2nd largest and fastest growing illegal enterprise in Southern California. However, given that it is growing faster than drug trafficking, it could become the largest illegal enterprise in a few short years with our children being the main target for sex trafficking. Labor trafficking is an even greater problem worldwide, and persists in local neighborhoods, households, businesses and industries. February 8th is the feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita who was kidnapped and sold into slavery in the late 1800's. On her feast day the Catholic community is asked to pray and take action in the fight against Human Trafficking.



St. Josephine Bakhita

Three actions that we can take that will make a difference are:

1. Pray for the healing of the victims and that God will change the heart of the Traffickers.
2. Protect the most likely victims. The most likely victims of Human Trafficking are foster children, homeless youth, the poor and immigrants. For that reason we can consider becoming foster parents and mentors. We can also volunteer for Catholic Charities, which is the largest charity in the U.S. with a focus on taking care of the poor and immigrants.
3. Make sure that for any purchase of imported products like tea, coffee and sugar, those products are marked "fair trade" meaning no slave labor was used in the growing, manufacturing and distribution of that product.
