



The first petition of the Prayed of Commendation prayed at each funeral Mass is: "Into your hands, father of mercies, we commend our dear sisters and brothers in the sure and certain hope that, together with all who have died in Christ, they will rise with him on the last day."

At the 9:00AM Mass last Sunday, our faith community properly recalled each member who died during the past year. We prayed for our family and friends not mentioned aloud. That the dead rise to eternal life is fundamental to the Good News of Jesus Christ – IT IS THE GOOD NEWS! Each funeral Mass is an Easter Mass of the Resurrection recalling the way that Jesus was the first to rise to new and eternal life; his will is that all will follow where he has gone, God's plan being that no-one be lost.

The funeral rite does not "dispose of remains" – it prays a soul to God, the One who is Love. Embraced by Love itself, the soul does not die. It cannot. Love keeps us with God and God keeps us in Love.

In our parish, the mercy of God is made manifest by our Bereavement Ministry. Deacon Pete Lauder, our music coordinators, and bereavement ministry "divide the grief and multiply the joy" of family and friends who gather to pray souls through the gates of paradise. Bereavement Ministry; the St. Juliana Falconieri Community If you (dear parishioner) want to experience a ministry of mercy, this one is open to you.

Last week I asked that you consider the lives of saints and significant leaders in our faith. Let me introduce you to two - from the distant past.

For me, a most interesting part of a faith hero is his/her conversion. Baby Boomers and older than me know the conversion path of Thomas Merton, the American monk Pope Francis spoke about during his visit to the USA. His autobiography is the moving story: The *Seven Story Mountain*.

Here are two others.

Constantine, born February 27, 272 died May 22, 337. Yes, Constantine the Great, in the Orthodox Church - St. Constantine the Great, the Holy Roman Emperor from 306-337. His mother was St. Helena, herself a convert to Christianity whose legacy includes building churches in Rome and on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, discovering the True Cross.

Constantine's conversion is famous. It is traced to a vision of Christ who told him to put the Greek letters *chi* and *rho*, actually Jesus' monogram, on his shield while in battle. Constantine was victorious and his whole army saw a luminous cross in the sky with the message "in this sign conquer." (Don't think of any Notre Dame Football game – it's rare that I have such moments of mirth!)



The reason I consider Constantine himself important to our faith is that under his reign the persecution of Christians and the destruction of Christian property not only ended but was allowed unlimited freedom to exist in the empire. If the date for the beginning of persecution by the Roman Government toward Christians is set with Nero in 64, the end of that period is set with Constantine's Edit of Milan in 313. In 321 Sunday was introduced as a legal day of festival. He called the First Council of Nicaea in 325, at which the Nicene Creed was professed by Christians. Such a revolution! Can anyone deny that Constantine is significant figure in the history of Christianity!

Thomas Bokenkotter, a Church historian, remarks: "The alliance with the state profoundly influenced every aspect of the Church's thought and life. It carried many advantages, but it also entailed some serious drawbacks: infringements on the Church's freedom as civil authorities exploited the relationship for political purposes; mass conversions where social conformity was the chief motivating factor; the widening of the gap between the clergy and laity thanks to the official status conferred on them; persecution of dissenters as a menace to the unity of the state. The Church would never be the same again – for better and for worse – and so Constantine's conversion is certainly one of the greatest turning points in the history of the Church and of the world." (*A Concise History of the Catholic Church*. P. 42) Fathom the idea: "in the unity of Church and State, the Church would never be the same" - wouldn't you expect a profound change in the State?

Another great faith hero is St. Augustine of Hippo, November 13, 354 – August 28, 430. He is called the "Father of Western Theology." His mother was St. Monica, whose statue is at the end of Wilshire Blvd. in Santa Monica, also the end of Route 66.

Augustine's conversion was profound. He was well educated and experienced religion in a number of ways, yet joy, even happiness eluded him. He turned to Christianity as he became disillusioned with nearly everything he thought could bring him joy including a concubine and child. He was instructed to read St. Paul's epistles when he realized he would be settled if he let his armor be the Lord Jesus Christ. Augustine abandoned everything and was converted by Ambrose, the Archbishop of Milan in 387. By 391 he was a priest and famous preacher. In 395 he was a bishop in his native Hippo in Africa.

It was the church that appealed to Augustine because it satisfied him when all other elements of life in the material and intellectual world failed. The Church reflected Christ and Augustine helped to establish that wonderful light offering the Catholic faith as a living religion.

His writings; *The Confessions* and *The City of God* remain on the Canon of Western Literature today, because those writings are so humanizing as they describe true happiness humans long for and devotion to God, the resting place of every restless soul. "*IDreamed I saw St. Augustine*" is a song recorded by Bob Dylan! As Augustine has influenced the thoughts of many philosophers, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI found him to be inspiring.

The enhancements of the interior of the church continue. Let us pray that the work we are undertaking continues to provide a suitable place for prayer and worship of Our Lord for all who enter our doors. Please note the following important dates:

On the weekends of Nov. 19/20, 26/27, and Dec. 3/4 Mass will be celebrated in the Parish Center.

There will be no Mass on Friday, Nov. 25th. There will be no morning or evening Mass on Saturday, Nov 26th.



November 13, 2016 Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

As this Jubilee Year of Mercy comes to an end, Jesus' first disciples ask what every age seems to wonder about the end of the world: "Teacher, when will this happen? What sign will there be?" (Luke 21:7). But instead of what we'd like to know, Jesus tells us what we need to know. Don't be terrified by natural disasters, human violence, personal sufferings. Because God's mercy abounds, all is grace. "It will lead to your giving testimony" (21:13). So Malachi promises "the sun of justice with its healing rays" (Malachi 3:20a); and Jesus describes how we should welcome the end: "Stand erect and raise your heads, because your redemption is at hand" (Gospel Acclamation, Luke 21:28).
