





Page Three ~ A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. ~ November 20, 2016



Since Pope St. John Paul II has died, many people of our age have suggested that he be titled "The Great." There were three "great" popes – St. Leo I, St. Gregory I, and St. Nicholas I. Let me introduce you to two.

Pope St. Leo the Great, born in the early years of the 400's was pope from 440-461. He carried on the Church's mission with theological clarity. The growth of our Church required the deep theology (understanding of God, Jesus, and Holy Spirit) that St. Augustine provided. So, what made Leo great was his theological presentations against various heresies. In those early days of our faith, the explanation of Jesus' union of human and divine natures was quite unclear. The fancy name for this is the "hypostatic union." I wrote a riveting paper in "Priest School" about this; unless you aren't sleeping well, don't ask me to share it. Pope St. Leo gathered the Council of Chalcedon in 451 to clarify the

mystery of the Incarnation explaining that Jesus is one person: true God perfect in that nature and true Man, complete and perfect in that nature. Jesus must be acknowledged as having two natures "without confusion or change, without division or separation." You can't picture Jesus as a small man with an extra big halo, or a big man with a small halo. Jesus is one hundred percent equal in both natures.

In his leadership Leo the Great famously met Attila the Hun at the gate (remember the rhyme) of Rome preventing the sack of Rome in 452. Rome was later sacked by Genseric, a vandal. The city, although occupied, was not burned.

Leo the Great was the first pope to be called "pontifex maximus". He argued the primacy of Peter over all the other apostles as is found in the Gospels and New Testament. Thus the pope became the primary ruler of the whole Church. All ministry is passed down from the pope in Rome, the bishop of Rome.

Lastly, Pope St. Leo the great was the first bishop of Rome to be buried in St. Peter's.

Pope St. Gregory the Great is known as the first medieval pope. His reign was from 590-604. St. He was born into a wealthy Roman family where he was raised. He was part of the highest order of politics in the city. Gregory left his wealth to monasteries. He even converted his own palace into a monastery where he lived a life of asceticism and study. During his papacy he established the importance of Rome in the Western World and Christianity. He became the ruler of central Italy and prepared the way for control of the future papal states.

During his time veneration of saints and relics became popular. He was impressed with the liturgy of the Benedictine monks and their way of life and preserving the faith with a variety of traditions. Although it is clear that he encouraged good liturgy and liturgical music, several church historians conclude: "The notion that he invented Gregorian chant is a legend."

I learned his motto: "Servus servorum Dei" (Servant of the Servant of God) as a school boy at St. Catherine's Academy. Gregory the Great is one of the saints in the chapel's long mural "Assent of Truth." Gregory was concerned with the spiritual goods of the Church and strengthened papal primacy over the churches of the West. His model of leadership was collegial, which was different from the hierarchical rule of Leo before him. Consider the difference of a round table discussion against a pyramid of descending power. The hierarchical model would again take shape during the Middle Ages. Under Gregory's reign the Roman Church spread throughout Europe, especially to the Anglo-Saxons. It is said of Gregory that it took Caesar six legions to conquer Britain; Gregory used only about forty monks. Lastly, he left a huge collection of theological and spiritual writings that would influence medieval thought.

In short, he was great because through his leadership the Church became the predominate force in shaping a new civilization; a political and cultural and social unity. Europe would become distinctively Christian by the religiously spiritual, political, and social order established by the direction of Pope St. Gregory the Great.

November is such a fantastic month! Remember the saints. Remember the souls. Remember how your Catholic faith is shaped by so many people who are "justified in the hands of God." Give thanks to God for all He has done and continues to do for each of us. Celebrate the Veterans of our Nation and Church. Remember, Give Thanks, Celebrate the presence of God among us.






