



Good Glory! Where did the year go? It's Advent Season once again! Once more we begin that season which begins the Church year. Christ the King, last Sunday ended the past year. Advent is another peculiar word we use in the church. It means "coming" or "arrival." After a long winter folks await the advent of spring. Here it is used to mark the four Sundays and weekdays in between the Sundays leading to Christmas, December 25, the day of the Lord's birth.

Like the Easter Triduum, the days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter itself, Advent indicates three comings of the Lord. The First Advent was the actual birth, life, death and resurrection of the Lord. He has come, he did live, and he died and rose to new and everlasting life. This has already happened. In our readings especially from Isaiah, the prophet, he recalls how people awaited the first coming of Jesus, the promised Hope

coming from Almighty God. He came into a waiting world as a baby, grew up as a man, and died for sinners.

The Second Advent is now, our time. We allow Jesus to come to us. We are a "pilgrim people" on a journey. Jesus comes to us in Word and Sacrament. If we allow him into our lives we develop a relationship with him in such a way that he guides us to his Father. We meet Jesus on Christmas Day once again, he brings joy, peace, and remains the example of good-will to all people who stop to acknowledge his presence renewed in our lives.

Finally, there is the third and final coming of Jesus in the future when he will return as King and Judge.

Advent is not meant to be a "mini-lent." It is not a time to give up but a time to count down. That's why homes might have "Advent Calendars" where a slide or window is opened each day and on December 25 there is a special window which hides Jesus himself. I like the calendar that allows, not prohibits, eating chocolate and various cookies and cakes!

The church counts down the days and weeks with the Advent Wreath of three blue or purple candles and one pink candle. Some wreaths conclude with a white "Jesus" candle in the center. Each Sunday a candle is chosen and each week that candle's flame marks the time awaiting the advent of Jesus. Therefore, one candle is lighted on the first week, it burns the entire week, the second on the second Sunday, and so forth. Some traditions assign a meaning to the candles: the first is the prophets, especially Isaiah, who predicted the coming of Jesus. The second candle is the Bible itself, which instructs us about the Good News of our salvation through the Father's gift of His son. The third candle – pink or rose in color - honors our Blessed Mother, Mary, the mother of the Lord. The Third Sunday of Advent indicates a day of joy, it's called Gaudete Sunday. There is a connection with the tradition of the Fourth Sunday in Lent, Laetare Sunday which carries a meaning of "rejoice!" I guess we all just need a time to take a breath during serious times! The fourth candle is the light of John the Baptist who told all who would listen to get ready for Jesus. John baptized Jesus and pointed to him as "the One". Some wreaths include a center or "Christ Candle" which is white indicating the arrival of Jesus on Christmas Day itself.

While the malls and society sing Christmas carols, Advent carols are appropriate for worship in the church. These are the great hymns of "People Look East", "Come, thou Long Expected Jesus," and the favorite "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel!" There are a few which celebrate John The Baptist. "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel!" is the hymn which contains the "O Antiphons". These are the antiphons which come before the proclamation of the Gospel beginning with "O Wisdom" on December 17th.

I encourage each of us to prepare the way for the Savior who did come to come once again into our lives, and show us the way to his Father. Use this time of Advent to slow down and reflect on the meaning of Jesus in our lives. Each day, develop anew your relationship with Jesus.

You will find useful Advent reflection guides in the Parish Center. Take time each day to "Prepare for yourselves the way of the Lord."

Thank you for your continual patience with "the project." I can't wait for its completion!




