Merry Christmas – parishioners, ministers, and visitors!

What are you doing today? Most likely what you have done as if by habit – you are imitating our ancestors of the l-o-n-g past. Not only decorating the home, preparing and eating various favorite sweets and entrée dishes, visiting others, welcoming folks into your home, buying and receiving clothes that don't fit, stuff that doesn't work, and wondering what to do with the fruit cake - today you've imitated our very first faith-filled ancestors. You have come here to find Jesus Christ. The birth of the Savior inspired a faith response from you: "Yes, I believe, help my unbelief." Many people hear the Gloria and Alleluia: "Today is born our Savior, Christ the Lord" and come to worship with prayerful song and celebration. Many people chose to walk on past the sacred scene to the mall and its "after the holiday sales." You've done the best you could do; you've come to worship with the community of God's People. If you are a regular, **welcome!** If you are a guest, **welcome!** We are all glad you're here. Do you notice anyone you've not met before? Is anything different? From here "Go and glorify the Lord by the way you live your life!" Please return!

It's quite common for a pastor to write a Christmas wish list to his parish – here's mine:

I wish everyone who comes here finds the Lord and leaves "Glorifying the Lord by the way you live your life." I wish you all good health and great joy. I wish you a warm welcome with the Blessings of the Lord.

I wish that all who come to St. Juliana Falconieri Parish find the Christ our Lord celebrated in word, sacrament, and community. I wish that we all truly experience conversion in mind, heart, and moral choices this year. I wish we sing heartily and pray aloud and audibly say "Amen" when we receive Holy Communion. I wish that we imitate our patron saint, Juliana, and grow stronger as a community, receive the Eucharist often, and learn our faith through our faith formation programs including our Catholic parish grammar school. I thank all who plan, lead, teach and attend faith formation classes. I am grateful to those who attend daily and Sunday Mass and who administrate, teach and staff, attend, and support our parish grammar school. GO FALCONS!

I wish that those who feel estranged from the Lord and His Church will return to this faith community through the faith witness or invitation of our parishioners. I wish we respect and accept one another.

I wish that especially our younger parish members and families will be engaged in this community as readers, ministers of the Holy Eucharist, and greeters (the ministry of usher) and members of committees and councils. I wish the post-confirmation members continue to be engaged members of our faith community.

I wish that we be known by the strength of our stewardship: all sharing time, talent, and treasury to become stronger in our commitment to serve as Jesus served – to love as Jesus loved. Not equal in giving but equal in sharing God's gifts to each of us.

I wish that many more parishioners and their friends will participate each first Tuesday of the month for our day of Eucharistic Exposition. Twenty-four hours of members, many of us, praying, worshiping in awe and wonder, thanksgiving, and petition. I wish that more parishioners and friends find time every day to pray, stopping into this church for a quiet moment of prayer and rejuvenation of your soul – as many find time to go to gyms and pubs and various secular venues - come to church.

I wish that inside the church, everyone will practice reverence for the tabernacle and its Sacred Inhabitant. I wish that the church be a place different from auditoriums/gymnasiums/theatres/public venues; I wish that water and beverages not be consumed during Mass and reverential silence be maintained while inside the church. As school students wear uniforms or "professional dress" for school Masses, Sunday church clothing might be the dress code for all.

THE GIFT OF GOD’S WORD

On this day of gifts and gift giving, it seems appropriate that we take a moment to reflect on the great gift of God’s Word. Because it is creative, God’s Word always points to its author, always calls us to respond. Because it is powerful, God’s Word can link the sublime with the ridiculous, the transcendent with the immanent, the divine with the human. Because it is graceful, God’s Word establishes a relationship of deep intimacy between us and God.



At the heart of God’s Word lies a tantalizing tension between the mysterious and the mundane. In our liturgical celebration, this unresolved tension both reveals the meaning of life for us and calls us to respond, to act upon that meaning.

Once accepted and opened, the gift of God’s Word is a gift that keeps on giving and keeps on calling us to give in return. It dares us to be like the gift-giver and to become gifts for others, not only at Christmas, but at every moment of life.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

An old joke asks, “What time is Midnight Mass?” (At St. Juliana Church, Midnight Mass starts at 10:30pm! ☺)

The answer is not really obvious, since Christmas is unique in having several distinct celebrations. The readings and prayers vary greatly from hour to hour. The Vigil Mass hinges on the family heritage of Jesus and his origins. The concept of “midnight” predates clock time, and really has to do with a celebration in the hours of darkness. Years ago, it was not possible to receive Communion without fasting for a full day, so the late hour of this Mass made it possible for the people to receive. The first Mass after sunrise, the Mass at Dawn, was once known as “The Shepherds’ Mass,” and later Masses set aside stories of Jesus’ birth to focus on the key to the day’s celebration: John the Evangelist’s majestic theology of Christ’s identity as the Word made flesh, dwelling among us. One feast, four separate Masses. Only monasteries manage the whole round. Parishioners typically take just one entry point into the mystery. Yet there is much to savor and celebrate in the coming of Christ into the world. Christmas is not a day, but a season. You still have two weeks to send those Christmas cards before you’re officially late!

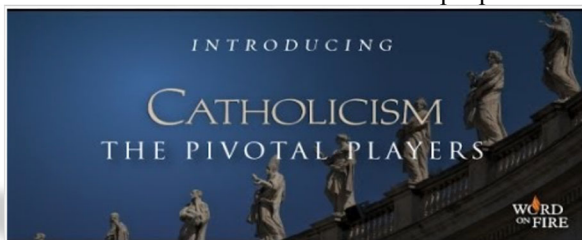

Pew removal was quite a job! Pews were donated to a church, mortuary and orphanage in Mexico.



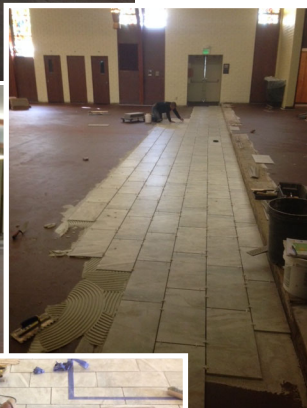
The last pew is removed from the church.
