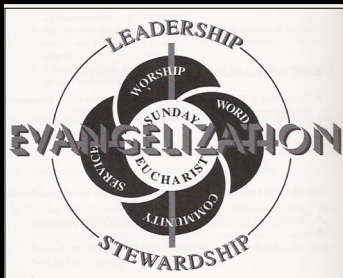

~ A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. ~



“The Kingdom of God is at hand, reform your life and believe.” That is the Gospel, the Good News, that Jesus preached. Reform, it’s all about change. Change! Not the easiest thing to do. With Lent, CHANGE, comes as a command. “Repent, and believe in the Gospel.”

Mostly, change is difficult. It means doing the usual thing differently, it means living somewhere else, it means going somewhere else; it means leaving the old behind and getting used to the “new normal.” Since I have moved, I have had to get used to a lot of change. Most of the change is rather trivial. The new dry cleaners I use hang my shirts with the hangers pointing to the left shoulder. In “Deep South Orange County” the hanger was to the right – Deep South Orange County points to the right in all matters! My shirts no longer hang all in the same direction. My bedroom window used to look out onto Mission San Juan Capistrano, now it looks to North Aca-cia Avenue. Change means “things aren’t the same anymore. Get used to the ‘new normal’.”

Some years ago, in the Ash Wednesday homily I taught: “Lent means *We Have a Mission to Change Our Condition.*” Let’s make a choice, to change our condition. Begin by doing right today and change for a life-time. “To live is to change – and to be perfect is to have changed often” -- that quote is attributed to Blessed John Henry Newman. What are you doing that needs to be changed?

Lent requires moral change; a change made by a deliberate decision; it is a choice. Moral change is synonymous with “conversion” and because it is a turn toward the moral right action, it ought to be a lasting habit.

What if – what if – this Lent your change wasn’t for forty days but rather for a life-time? We have all tried to give up – candy, liquor, television, cake, ice cream, etc. – for the forty days of Lent. Sometimes we went through “white knuckle” moments, craving what was given up during that birthday party, or the supreme temptation - St. Patrick’s Day. (Father, you WILL excuse us today, won’t you?) In any case Lent was “give up” then return to old normal on Holy Thursday night.

This Year of Mercy, begin doing something that will eventually become a habit. Notice other human beings as Jesus did - “with love.” Attend to the needs of other human beings. Learn your faith so that you can live it better; teach others what you know, not by a lecture, but by a life-style of mercy, compassion, and kindness. Forgive. Be patient. Comfort. Each is an act of mercy.

If we wish Almighty God to shower His mercy on us, should we not shower others with mercy?

This Lent, for the rest of our lives, let us make a decision to be merciful, let us make a decision to correct our faults, let us “turn away from harmful pleasures” and direct our lives to our perfect end: to know the splendor of God for eternity. What act imitates God and builds relationships more than love? What act is more harmful to any relationship than self-ishness, love’s antonym?

School yard bullying will end, the person who always sits alone will have a partner, the person who does not have even water will no longer be thirsty because you noticed and served, you acted with love.

Come Easter Sunday and the rest of your life, what will your “new normal” be? The divine charge to “be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect” is a change in the right direction.

Wednesday, February 17, is the Feast of the Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order. Beginning Monday, February 15th and for the week, Fr. Luke and I will gather with the rest of our province at Mater Dolorosa Retreat Center in Sierra Madre to renew our community and elect new leadership for the next four years. I hope the Chicagoans will enjoy So Cal in February! Pray they return home soon and safely! Please pray for us as we pray for you.

Join us for Fr. Mike and Fr. Luke's birthday celebrations!
