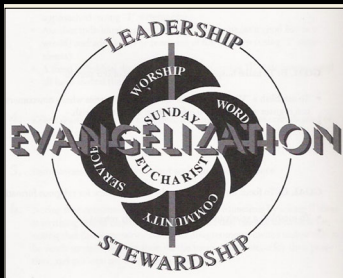

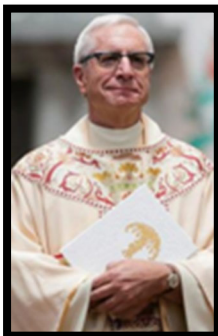

Today's readings present us with two very different plants. The first is the burning bush Moses encountered. It's a "remarkable sight" on fire but not burned up. The other is a lone fig tree, scarcely alive it is only planted.

We are the community of St. Juliana Falconieri—we are alive with the presence of God's love, hope and generosity. Transformed by the God who loves us, this community takes on the identity of the Lord our God. As disciples of Jesus we are rich in mercy, forgiveness, and kindness.

There is an option, that other tree. We can protect ourselves from annihilation; blind ourselves to Light and Life. We can distract our lives with routine, busyness, electron social media, not even real human interaction--so that God won't intrude on our security, so that we needn't hear any unsettling request from God, family, neighbor or.....PASTOR!

Lent sets a choice before us – life and death. The readings set a choice – ablaze with God or wait and see. One tree gives life the other does not even give shade. It does no harm, neither does it do good. Like the fellow in another familiar parable, he buried the only talent he thought he had.

Today and right now I am asking you, once more, to stand up and be counted. Will you reach out beyond the comfortable and routine to a larger radius of awareness? Will you please not only take time be thankful for your life, but take time to ensure the life of this community church remains alive in East Fullerton?

Today we begin our 2016 Pastoral Services Appeal Campaign. I am most thankful to you for your efforts in last year's PSA appeal. Last year the Diocese of Orange set our PSA Goal at \$109,000.00. As always any amount we reach beyond their goal comes back to this parish. We set a parish goal of \$225,000 and 500 donations. The 2015 result is: 502 donors, including myself, pledged \$194,849. To date \$190,424 has been paid. Our parish continues to receive rebate checks, our total rebate to date is \$81,424. Thank you so much! Let's pat ourselves on our backs and applaud our 2015 efforts.

I am pleased to tell you that the entire rebate was used to reduce the debt owed the Diocese of Orange on our Parish Center. The current debt on the Parish Center loan is \$340,478.13.

This year the Diocese set its St. Juliana goal at \$110,000. The Advancement Committee of our parish set a goal of \$300,000 from 550 donors. Goals can be accomplished, even exceeded. Certainly not everyone will be able to give at the same level. As always, it's a matter of responsibility and justice. Not equal giving but equal sharing and equal sacrifice. None of us, rich and poor, young or old, is without the obligation of responsible stewardship. Let's encourage a "culture of giving" among our younger members!

Please reflect on the ministries of our diocese, the service the diocese gives to the Body of Christ and its needs.

Do not overlook the needs of our parish church. This year I am directing the rebate to help fund some necessary renovations to this church, the place where we gather to worship Almighty God.

I have divided a modest project into two parts. The first is the structure of this church. The diocese is requiring a seismic retrofit on our church building. The total expense for the seismic retrofit of this building will be \$315,000. We are responsible for \$115,000 of that amount. **Bishop Vann's office, the Diocese of Orange, will contribute the remaining \$200,000.** Our church needs a new roof. This one leaks in multiple places. It also needs an HVAC system up-grade. Such an up-grade will comfort us and soften our utility bills.

The second part will enhance our worship space itself, what we and our visitors see. I propose reframing the windows and changing out the doors on the front entrance of our church, the Melody Lane entrance. Replacing the flooring, refinishing the pews, and painting the interior are all needs. Our "cry room" needs some love. The ceiling, lighting, and walls want to be refreshed. There are three different styles of pews in it. Let's correct that arrangement.

Complete information will be presented soon. Wishes, wants, and costs have not been totally researched and developed at this time. The project will be manageable; we will not bite off more than we can chew. Suffice it to conclude, this year let's designate the PSA rebate to our church where we and our visitors gather to give praise to our God.

Once more, please consider this time as an opportunity for you to reflect on your regular generosity to your parish community. Regular donations to the church have not increased, neither have they kept pace with operational costs of the parish. Your on-going generosity help all of us.

On-line giving is most helpful. On-line giving provides the parish with a regular contribution which greatly helps us budget income and pay expenses. On-line giving is an option for you on the parish web-site: www.stjulianachurch.org.

If you would like to designate your contribution to a particular parish need, I am happy to speak with you. Perhaps the choir, faith formation, youth ministry or some area of your interest can be funded directly by your generosity.

Thank you for so much for so long. We are the Catholic face of Jesus alive with the presence of God. Alive, our tree is growing. May this ministry of Christ at St. Juliana Falconieri which began as a sign of His love, continue with service to His good people. Together we accomplish great things. **GO FALCONS! GO FALCONS! GO FALCONS! GO FALCONS!**

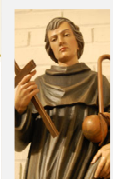

RCIA FIRST SCRUTINY— 9AM MASS

This Sunday at the 9:00am Mass we celebrate the RCIA "First Scrutiny" for those in our catechumenal process who are preparing for the Sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist) at the Easter Vigil. Next week, we celebrate the RCIA "Second Scrutiny," and on March 13th we celebrate the RCIA "Third Scrutiny."

The three Scrutinies are among the most ancient prayers in the Christian liturgical tradition. As early as the second century, Christian communities would help those who had been chosen for Baptism to prepare for their initiation by laying of hands and prayer. These very moving and powerful prayers ask God's protection on those who will soon become full members of our Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist.
