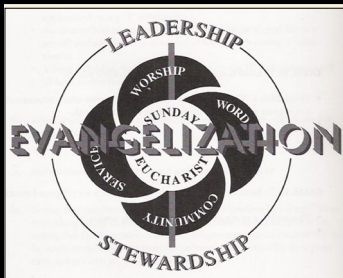

~ A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. ~



The gospels are replete with fishing lessons. Today is the lesson of the Great Catch. Look carefully, is it simply *fishermen catching* fish or is it *fishermen being caught* by the Great Teacher? Fishermen always have a story to tell. What is this story? Is it about fishing or discipleship? Which will catch you?

"Come and Follow Me"

Peter and the men were having a rough go of it. All night they tried and all night they caught nothing. They didn't even have a tale about the "one that got away!" Then, out of nowhere, Jesus instructs Peter to put out, into the deep, the unknown. He was resistant, but it was there that they had such a great catch that they were in danger of losing nets, boat, and possibly their lives. All they needed was to be obedient to the command of Jesus. The command being: "If you want to be fulfilled, be my disciple, Come and Follow Me."

Have you been caught by anything lately? Were you motivated to buy something you didn't even know you wanted, let alone could not live without?

This is Super Bowl Sunday. I'm taking a guess which it might be – Frito-Lay, Budweiser, Chevrolet, Toyota. All of them are saying: "If you want to be fulfilled, be our disciple, Come, Follow." In thirty seconds, they will convince (catch) you that you didn't even know you had an important need that will be fulfilled (conversion of the heart) only when you purchase and use (move to act, moral conversion) their product which will forever change your life (total conversion). It's done without the consumer even knowing – until the bills come. While you are watching the Super Bowl, know that a thirty second ad spot will cost \$5M, not counting the money to produce the piece. That's up 11% from last year! Will your life be resurrected by these prophets?

"Come and Follow Me" was Jesus' command to life in abundance. Fulfillment not through ownership, fame, fortune, sex, or power, but in a relationship with the One who will forgive sin and change death into life. Jesus' intention for a follower was rather unconventional.

Which "Come follow me" will work best on you – Jesus' Gospel or the corporate sales force? Be attracted to Jesus and your sins will be forgiven, life will be yours in abundance and life will never end. That new truck comes with a guarantee of limited miles and months and most likely its purchase will follow with payments for years and years! Then it will be abandoned for the next popular ad appeal.

Many times especially young people are left unhappy: "I've got everything; I'm smart, athletic, good-looking, very popular, and employed. I go to the Happiest Place on Earth often. Why aren't I the happiest person on earth?"

Choose Jesus who will make a difference in your life. Convert yourself to the Lord of Life. Become a disciple of Jesus today for the rest of your life.

Receive him often in the sacraments. Mass is celebrated each morning at 6:30 and 8:00. Come; visit Jesus in Solemn Exposition each First Tuesday. Come visit Him in this church every day. Don't neglect him, he is calling you to develop and use your talents so that you, his disciple, will be his presence in your community. Build a well-built faith, attend faith-formation classes. Join a small Christian community. Go on a retreat. Read and reflect on the daily Gospel reading, then act on what you've read.

Whose message will catch you? On which message will you act? Can you figure the cost of your choice? To your own self be true.

ASH WEDNESDAY-FEBRUARY 10TH

The website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops – USCCB.ORG – is the site for accurate information about our Catholic Church in the United States. Copied from that site is the following regulation regarding Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays of Lent and our diet: **"Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards."**

Lent is not only about dietary laws! It is about the reforming of life and the returning to the Gospel.

What might one do during Lent to "reform life and return to the Gospel?" In this Year of Mercy, consider performing an act of mercy- or receiving one! *Feed the hungry* – give food to the Food Bank. *Clothe the naked* – clean your closet and give to those who are without adequate clothing. *Care, shelter, visit* – do an act of compassion, give care to the life of another person you would not normally reach out toward. *Acknowledge the one who is forgotten*; sit with the one who sits alone at lunch. Stop the bully.

Convert sinners, instruct the ignorant, advise the doubtful, comfort the sorrowful – even yourself! Read a book that will inform your faith. Attend "Building a Well-Built Faith" faith formation class or all of them! Help children with homework, but don't do it for them! *Bear wrongs patiently, forgive injuries* – become a patient person. Listen to understand before you respond to the other. Take time and notice the good things, give God thanks for all He has done for you. *Pray for the living and the dead* – increase your prayer time. Pray not only for your needs but for other people and their needs. Make prayer intentional. Spend time in the church, it's open! Visit the Blessed Sacrament on the First Tuesday in our church. Begin the morning with a prayer, offer a prayer of thanks for the meal before you eat, remember those who do not have the good things you are enjoying, and at night review your day. Two different reflection resources: the "Black Book" and "Returning to God" a Lenten reflection book by Henri Nouwen are in the back of the church, **chose one** and follow its reflection daily. They are available until they are taken.

Lent is a time to reform your life and return to the Gospel -- what will you do? It's not only (or even) giving up, it can be "doing" beginning this Lent and lasting a life-time! Make mercy a way of life, not one event during the year!
