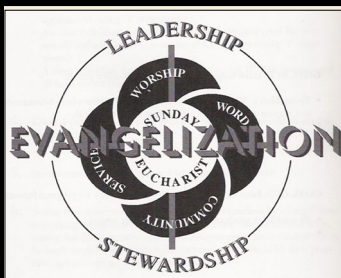

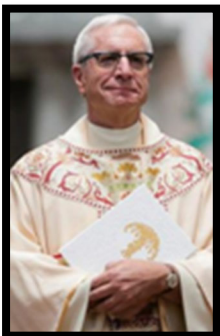

~ A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. ~

The lesson taught in the regular cycle of readings, Cycle C, the woman caught in the very act of committing adultery is forgiveness. After everyone left her without throwing one stone at her, Jesus said to her: “Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more.” Cycle A, used for the rites of those who will be baptized at Easter teaches rebirth. This is the lesson of removing the stone from Lazarus’ tomb, calling him to new life. Forgiveness and rebirth, one act of faith or two? Forgiveness and rebirth, certainly the emblem of Christian people.

In every act of forgiveness there is a rebirth. There is a death to the past and promise of new life in the present into the future. Growth never happens without death, leaving behind something with the hope of life changed: “Unless a grain of wheat should fall to the ground and die, it remains alone. If it dies, it springs up again, a hundredfold.” As the prodigal son was forgiven, the father said: “My son was dead and is now alive!”

The will of God is that nothing be lost: psst – that’s what “Thy Will Be Done” means. The will of God is that life will always start over, more profoundly than it was. “This sickness shall not end in death” – of course not, resurrected life is more abundant than life as we know it. Leave ninety-nine sheep, find the one lost sheep. The resurrected Jesus conquers death in such a way that “life is changed not ended.”

Lazarus and “the woman known as a sinner” are both resurrected – from sin – from death – to new life.

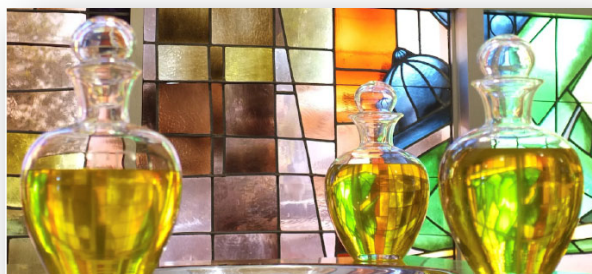
Hearing a confession of sin, how fast are you to judge, condemn; never throwing a single stone – that’s too easy! How long does it take to approach Jesus to forgive your sin and allow you to start strong growth toward grace? Do you reconcile with another human being?

Death is the only way to rebirth. Forgiveness is the only way to grace. What must you surrender? What must you do so that someone else may grow? What is God asking you to let die so that you will experience life better than before? Can you name people who are lost and/or estranged? How will you seek them out and bring them back to a relationship that is life-giving? What does the Year of Mercy and Lent/Easter offer to help bring these people back to life?

IMPORTANT! This year, take time to celebrate the Easter ritual fully. *Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord’s Supper, Friday of the Passion of the Lord (Good Friday), and The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night (Holy Saturday, Easter Vigil) or Easter Sunday in the daytime are three ceremonies which make the one complete Feast of Easter.* Mass on Holy Thursday will be at 7:00PM followed by the repose of the Lord until 12 mid-night in the Parish Center. The Good Friday Solemn Ceremony begins at 1:00PM. The Great Easter Vigil starts at 7:00PM. If you don’t attend the Great Vigil, Easter Day Mass times are 7:30AM, 9:00AM, and 11:00AM. ***I encourage you to keep the celebration and to celebrate with joy.*** THERE ARE NO MORNING MASSES celebrated on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, or Holy Saturday; instead Morning Prayer is prayed at 8:00AM, all the faithful are invited at that time. ***Please bring hand bells to ring during the Gloria at the Great Easter Vigil Mass.*** Let’s celebrate the forgiveness of our sins and promise of eternal life.



There is one more Easter related celebration to attend! **The Chrism Mass at Christ Cathedral Campus (The Arboretum Church) on Monday, March 21.** Together with Bishop Vann and the many priests and deacons of our diocese as well as parishioners from each parish, please attend the Mass which blesses the Holy Oils to be used in the diocese for the coming year. It’s a festive celebration! If you have never been to it, come. If it’s been some while since you attended it last, do it again. If you participate every year, do it once more. This celebration begins at 5:30PM; it’s at Christ Cathedral (formerly Crystal Cathedral) 13280 Chapman Avenue, Garden Grove, CA 92840.

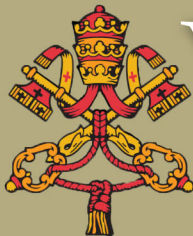

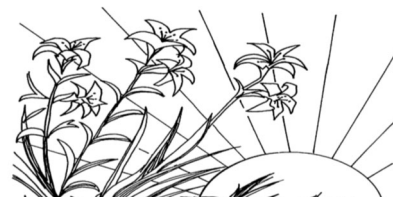

RESPECT LIFE NEWS AND INFORMATION

REPEAL OF THE DEATH PENALTY IN CALIFORNIA

This weekend, March 12 & 13, after Masses, you will have the opportunity to sign the Petition to have an initiative measure put on the November ballot for registered Californians to vote on for the REPEAL OF THE DEATH PENALTY IN CALIFORNIA. If passed, the Death Penalty would be replaced with life imprisonment without possibility of parole. This would apply retroactively to persons already sentenced to death. There have been 900 people sentenced to death in California and only 13 executed during this time. Appeals can take up to 25 years. Right now there are 746 men on death row in San Quentin and 20 women in Chowchilla. It has been many years since anyone on death row in California has been executed. We taxpayers in California are spending millions and millions to prop-up the Death Penalty, \$1,370,000.00. If their sentence is changed to Life without possibility of parole, they then must work while in prison. 60% of the wages earned by these prisoners would then be applied to any victim restitution fines or orders against them. The net reduction in state and local government costs to house these prisoners would potentially be around \$150 million annually. The system right now does not work. Morally, we believe that all life is sacred. Police verify that the Death Penalty does not deter crime. And it would protect persons that have been wrongfully accused and after many years in prison are found to be innocent. Who knows how many innocent people in this country have been executed? Please prayerfully consider taking a few moments of your time to do this as you leave Mass or before you enter church too, if you have time. There will be people from our parish at the tables to help you do this.

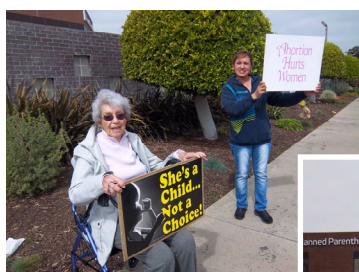


THE LIFE AT CONCEPTION ACT

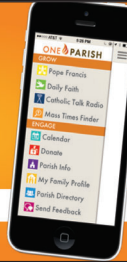
