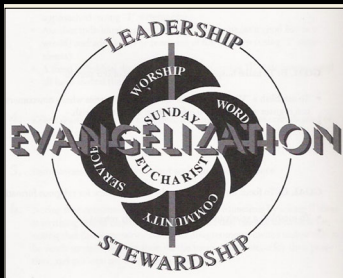

The gospel lesson is the Prodigal Son. Have you ever looked into the dictionary for the meaning of *prodigal*? “Prodigal – adj. – recklessly wasteful. Lavish” Synonyms include: “generous.” The narrative has three main characters. Which one is most generous? Who is “recklessly wasteful”? Careful, does that description fit only the son who wastes his inheritance or does it describe the Father who is generous with his mercy? Did the elder waste anything? Does this lesson remind you of yourself – at all? Does it tell you when you have “missed the mark” that is to say, “sinned?” When did you hold back forgiveness or mercy? Do you refuse to accept mercy and forgiveness?

We have been taught that the younger son is the way-word, the “prodigal.” This boy has struck out. Strike one, he left home. He spent his money in a wasteful and reckless way, strike two. Strike three, he left his religion. He’s out. But he “came to his senses” and headed for home, not the dugout.

Reading the story as a producer might, picture the Father. He is out in the field. He wants his son home with him, he longs for his son whom he misses so much. Day and night he is out in the field looking for any sight of his younger boy. Dad is praying, pacing, and looking into the distance. Suddenly the boy is in sight! The man is excited! **He** is recklessly wasteful, prodigal! He commands the servants: “**QUICKLY!** Robe my son, put shoes on his feet, and kill the best calf we have, open vintage wine. Let’s have a party! Invite the village! My son, who was lost, has been found! He was dead, now he is home alive!

Forget any accounting for the kid’s time or money. Do not ask for any confession, and assign no penance! Free him of any shame! Do this quickly! Be sure he **experiences**, greater than words can speak: “You are beyond forgiven, you are absolved, you are home and you are mine!”

Now the elder boy. He’s smug; self-righteous as a Pharisee. For the choreographer, he is present, standing at the door of Paradise but refuses to enter. His alibi is: “Look, it just isn’t fair! My brother didn’t play by the rules. But I have. I’ve done as you asked me my whole life and all you’ve given me is a home and your presence in it. You just can’t reward this cheater like that. What about me? I’m getting cheated!”

The truth is the Father loves both of the boys because they are his. The Father wants to redeem them both because he loves them. That’s what love does.

Your father is calling you home. Just come home. When, if not today?

I used this lesson while I was teaching high school seniors, all of them boys. “Imagine” I began, “it’s spring break. Your daughter came home. She stood in the door-way and presented herself; pierced, tattooed, and pregnant. Now dad, what do you do?” How long it took the students to say: “Love her.” Your daughter had the courage to come home, to the place where, when you go there, they have to take you in. Wouldn’t you do the same if your son had the courage to tell you he is seeking a divorce or is gay? What about your younger brother who is featured in the nightly news because he is an inmate on death row. You might not like him, do you love him? And this discussion after what was for most of them twelve years of Roman Catholic education.

The gospel has only one real message – rebirth. It calls for one action – mercy.

Do you encourage those who no longer participate in their faith to come home again? Will your relationship with Jesus bring someone into our community for the first time? By your prodigal actions, will others join the Body of Christ?

Go and proclaim the Good News! Be merciful as the Father is merciful!

Both Father Luke and I thank you for your love and generosity to us on the occasion of our birthdays. Thank you for thanking us, praying for us, sharing with us, indeed loving us. We love you too! May God bless each of you with his abundant mercy!

In the vestibule you will find a new book shelf - “take a book, leave a book” or perhaps just a take a book and return it after adoration or prayer time if you don’t have one to leave. As a kind of library, it’s there for you/us. Please, let us all keep the vestibule clean without clutter. After you use a table, chair, podium, or easel please return the item(s) to the “cage.”

Rebirth of a good experience! Thank you to each of you who came to the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament! WOW – I am pleased that we have 24 Hour Exposition and that, as I am writing this, so many are present with Jesus. May this parish experience rich friendship with the Lord! Young and old, come each first Tuesday of the month. Come as a family! Come intentionally! Mark your calendars; increase your desire to be with Our Lord.

Please note the schedule for the Great Three Days of our Faith (the Triduum) – Holy Thursday Evening Mass at 7:00PM, Good Friday Solemn Ceremony at 1:00PM, and the Great Easter Vigil at 7:00PM. Kindly consider Easter as one celebration of three ceremonies. Don’t miss the Father’s Mercy and the Lord’s rebirth.

Lastly, would each Eucharistic Minister, Lector, and Usher please attend one of two meetings to be held in the church on Wednesday, March 9 at 7:00PM or Saturday, March 12 at 9:00AM. Thank you for your service to our community.

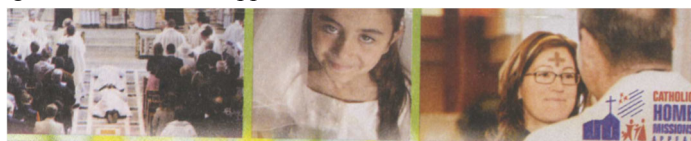

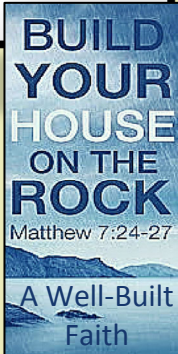

REPEAL OF THE DEATH PENALTY IN CALIFORNIA

On March 12 & 13, after Masses, you will have the opportunity to sign the Petition to have an initiative measure put on the November ballot for registered Californians to vote on for the REPEAL OF THE DEATH PENALTY IN CALIFORNIA. If passed, the Death Penalty would be replaced with life imprisonment without possibility of parole. This would apply retroactively to persons already sentenced to death. There have been 900 people sentenced to death in California and only 13 executed during this time. Appeals can take up to 25 years. Right now there are 746 men on death row in San Quentin and 20 women in Chowchilla. It has been many years since anyone on death row in California has been executed. We taxpayers in California are spending millions and millions to prop-up the Death Penalty, \$1,370,000.00. If their sentence is changed to Life without possibility of parole, they then must work while in prison. 60% of the wages earned by these prisoners would then be applied to any victim restitution fines or orders against them. The net reduction in state and local government costs to house these prisoners would potentially be around \$150 million annually. The system right now does not work. Morally, we believe that all life is sacred. Police verify that the Death Penalty does not deter crime. And it would protect persons that have been wrongfully accused and after many years in prison are found to be innocent. Who knows how many innocent people in this country have been executed? Please prayerfully consider taking a few moments of your time to do this as you leave Mass or before you enter church too, if you have time. There will be people from our parish at the tables to help you do this.



THE LIFE AT CONCEPTION ACT

This legislation will be introduced in the US Senate and Congress sometime during this legislative session. The California Pro-Life Council is urging you to contact your Senators and Congressman to ask them to support this legislation. If voted on, passed, and put into law by the President, it would declare the unborn child a PERSON from the moment of conception and then that new life would be protected under the 14th Amendment. 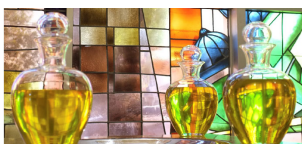

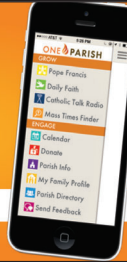
