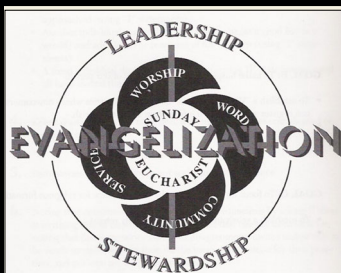

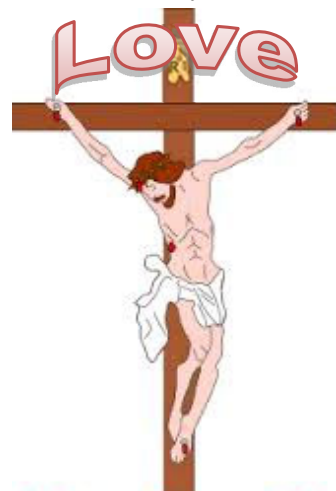


~ A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. ~

The sacraments of the church are celebrated and taught as units. Grouping the ones that have something in common is a convenient way to learn how we celebrate these encounters with Christ. The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion. The Sacraments of Healing are Penance and The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. That leaves Marriage and Holy Orders as the Sacraments of Communion and Mission.

Both Holy Orders and Marriage are sacraments of ministry; they are directed for the good of other people. The result of neither sacrament can ever be selfishness. Both sacraments are intended for service. The way we help each other “pursue holiness.” Marriage and Holy Orders are both “sacraments of intimate partnership and love” or they won’t work.

Love is a difficult word to define. Certainly you can go to your favorite dictionary and there research a meaning of “love”. However, I am sorry; the dictionary definition usually defines love as “affection,” “relations,” and in some games such as tennis “no score!” Nope, these words won’t work. Love is service to another. Love says; “You stay in bed, I’ll tend to the baby.” Love says; “No more for you and that’s final. I know you aren’t going to like me.” The opposite of love is not hate. Love’s opposite is selfishness. The Sacrament of Marriage and Holy Orders says: Love is imitating Jesus Christ’s command to “Love one another as I have loved you.” The one thing you cannot be, when you love, is selfish. Love is Holy Thursday – service. Love is Good Friday – sacrifice. Love is Easter Sunday – gift. If you want to see love, look at the crucifix and see a human being all used up in service.



Today is “Vocation Sunday.” Our church sets aside today as a special day to encourage you to listen to the voice of God telling you how you will spend your life in love/service. In marriage men and women selflessly commit themselves to be responsible for each other “until death.” Marriage reminds us that we are all called to selfless love; an intimate partnership and love for each other and a family. Marriage remains a rich symbol of God’s love, a sign of the covenant of God and his people. Whenever a man and woman come to me and say we want to talk to you about getting married, I ask: “Why do you want to get married?” I keep asking the question until they tell me the one answer I am looking for: “We love each other!” Then I ask: “Are you willing to serve each other?” Then I comment: “Why are you frowning?”

Another rich sign of love and service in our Church is religious life and priesthood. Reflect on the lives of men and women who serve in the Church as religious brothers and sisters as well as those men who are deacons, priests, bishops, arch-bishops, cardinals, and The Pope. Some men and women are called to belong to a religious community - a religious family - like the Servites, Norbertines, Dominicans, Franciscans, Jesuits, Disciples of Mary Moderator, Salesians, Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange, and etc. As members of a community they belong to a group that has a particular founding, spirituality, governance, and work or mission in the Church. Religious take vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience; forgoing family, stuff, and some choices - religious share all things as described in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts. 4:32-37). Diocesan priests serve the local bishop directly. Their usual ministry is in parishes. By their service to The Word of God and The Sacraments, they seek to bring all people into God’s holy family. All are called to serve the people of God and shepherd everyone toward God.

As we pray that marriage becomes strong and lasts a life-time of unselfish love, pray too that many people hear the call of God and spend their life in service to God’s People as brothers, sisters, and deacons and priests.

Ultimately, every baptized person has one goal in life, to pursue holiness. How will you fulfill your life in service and love, communion and mission?

THE SHEPHERD'S FLOCK

In Christian art, the earliest depictions of Jesus Christ were not of his crucifixion or of his resurrection. The first known renderings of Jesus show him as the Good Shepherd, the image put before us in today's readings. In the Gospel passage Jesus reveals that he is the shepherd and his followers are his "flock."

In the first and second readings, we are told more about the flock. The passage from Acts assures us that both Jews and Gentiles are called to follow Jesus. It is faith, not birthright, that makes us part of the company of believers. In the passage from the book of Revelation we learn that the flock that follows this Lamb of God will also be washed in his blood. They will endure a time of trial before they enjoy eternal life. 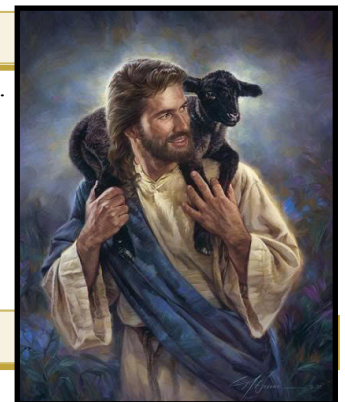
JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

Fourth Sunday of Easter

Good Shepherd Sunday: World Day of Prayer for Vocations

This Sunday celebrates Jesus as "the Good Shepherd." When announcing this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis focused on Jesus' "lost sheep" parable in Luke. "[Who] among you," Jesus asks, "having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it?" (Luke 15:4). A reasonable answer? "No responsible shepherd who wants to keep the job!" Yet Jesus considers *one* lost person supremely important and suggests blaming the shepherd. The sheep didn't "go astray," the shepherd "lost" it. Thus, "when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy" (15:5). That tender image of Jesus adorns the simple cross Pope Francis has always worn, the Good Shepherd gently carrying the lost sheep home on his shoulders. During this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, may we, who once were lost ourselves but now are found, join Jesus in seeking, finding, and gently carrying home at least one precious lamb.

Visual Acuity

~ assesses how well one can see

Retinoscopy

~ determines one's prescription for glasses

~ checks for eye alignment and crossed eyes

~ checks for color blindness

Direct Ophthalmoscopy

~ evaluates the health of the back of the eye by a direct look into the eye

~ measures the eye pressure as it relates to glaucoma

If you have a problem with someone, gossiping isn't the best answer because it will give you more guilt than pleasure and can ruin someone's reputation. Some things that I can do daily not to gossip are to walk away when I hear gossip or to stop the gossip by saying something nice about the person being talked about. Another way is to think before I speak and make sure that what I am about to say won't hurt anyone. These things help me become a better person by helping me to stay out of unnecessary drama that can be put back onto me and keep me from being the bully. I will know people better by not listening to gossip because it's not always true. Not gossiping and not judging others go hand in hand but are different at the same time.

Pope Francis really challenged us with the resolution, "Stop judging others." Even if your friends or your parents are doing it, judging others is still bad and might refrain you from meeting a new friend. To not judge others includes accepting everyone you meet, no matter what they look like, how they speak, where they are from, or how they treat you or me. It also includes not refraining from meeting someone based on your judgments because not everyone is who they seem to be in your mind. How I can apply this to my daily life is to talk to and be kind to everyone I meet, no matter what I think of them and to stand up for those who are outcast because of the way people judge them. This will help me become a better person because by meeting new people, I can gain new friendships and experiences in life just by not having judgmental thoughts. I can accept more people I meet just by the way they are. Pope Francis's resolutions can really change you into a better person even if you aren't Catholic. Just by being happy you can see God in everyone and by not gossiping you can stop yourself from being a bully. By not judging others you can gain new friendships and experiences from meeting people and getting to know them. These resolutions will truly change me as I work through the year to accomplish and use them.
