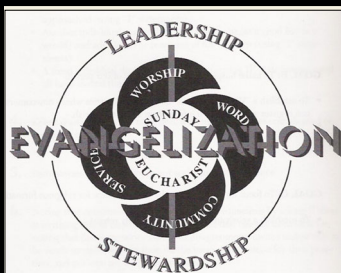

~ A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. ~

I have several favorite Catholic authors, one of whom is the Dominican priest and former leader of the entire Dominican Order, Fr. Timothy Radcliffe, OP. He writes an interesting line in his book *What is the Point of Being a Christian*: “Our eccentric Christian lives should puzzle other people.” Among the eccentricities is our ceremony, celebration, and practice of the sacraments. If an uninitiated person or not fully initiated Catholic were to walk into a church when a sacrament is being celebrated, the ceremony might seem odd, eccentric, and puzzling. We take water made holy and pour it, oil made holy and smear it, bread and wine are changed in substance (transubstantiated) into the Real Presence of Jesus, gestures of the cross, men prostrate on the floor, and all the rest might seem like something out of the movies. That includes both the silly and spooky movies. Yet, nothing is more essential to our being Roman Catholic than our seven sacraments.

For those who haven't yet learned, the traditional and still useful definition of a sacrament is: “A sacrament is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give grace.” (Baltimore Catechism #304 with a star before it – those are the ones we have to know.) Jesus himself is the primary sacrament, the greatest gift of all from God. Through Jesus we are let in on the secret of who God is and what He is all about. In seven sacraments, we celebrate the presence of Christ among us in a most special way. Through these seven gifts, we encounter Christ who reaches out to us. Jesus reaches us in very ordinary ways of life. It's the only way he can! As a baby. With water, bread, wine, oil, and light. As a preacher. As a victim. Christian love is rather eccentric, it means “forgetting the self and serving the other. You are more important than I am.”

Sacraments are eccentric ways of celebrating something quite ordinary. Let's begin with the group of three sacraments of initiation. Baptism celebrates belonging to a community, specifically the Church, the community of the Body of Christ. We live no longer as mere humans but as disciples of Jesus Christ.

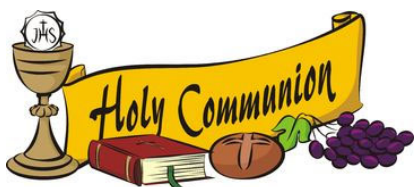


Baptism is often referred to as the “Sacrament of Faith.” Essential to baptism is the union of the baptized with Christ and His Church. In its celebration the beliefs of our faith coded in the creed are recited, the big Easter candle of our faith is lighted, and water is blessed and poured. The water is made holy remembering Jesus, the One who said: “Go and make disciples of all the nations. Know that I will be with you until the end of the age.” Jesus gives us a command; “Make disciples.” Jesus gives us a promise; “I will be with you.” As we fulfill his command, so will he fulfill his promise. At the baptism of an infant we also pray that the parents of the baptized child who will be the first teachers of their child in the ways of the faith will be the best of teachers. We pray the church community will be supportive as we witness to Christ in our lives.

Christians cannot be baptized and live passively. Essentially, Christian faith is a choice. It is the choice to accept Jesus, receive his special friendship and grace, and choose to make our decisions accordingly. Baptism begins the conversion, the change of mind, heart, and manner of life. We live no longer for ourselves but for Christ who lives in us. In accepting baptism we are turning away from what is not God to that which will make us holy, perfect, and pleasing to God.

These eccentric ceremonies along with their instruction are meant to change us, personally change us; that is a change in our personality. We are to have a “Christian Personality.” How is your life different because you are baptized?

Next week, many of our youth are receiving Jesus in their First Holy Communion. Older ones are receiving the fullness of initiation in the Sacrament of Confirmation. As a community we are joyfilled that our faith is continuing to the next generation. If you are receiving the sacraments, thank you for preparing yourselves. If you have prepared a child to receive the sacrament, thank you. If you are a sponsor or witness, with God's grace, be a supportive one.

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Jubilee Day for Youth

This Sunday's "Youth Jubilee" previews July's World Youth Day in Krakow. Its theme from Matthew 5:7, "Blessed are the merciful," echoes Pope Francis' warning that "the practice of mercy is waning in the wider culture." In countercultural witness, therefore, "the time has come," says Francis, "for the Church to take up the joyful call to mercy once more. It is time to return to the basics and to bear the weaknesses and struggles of our brothers and sisters." Jesus affirms the same in today's Gospel. "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (John 13:34). Francis concludes, "The Church's very credibility is seen in how she shows merciful and compassionate love." Jesus too asserts, "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). Thus mercy "makes young" the Church, the world, and everyone. "Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 10).
