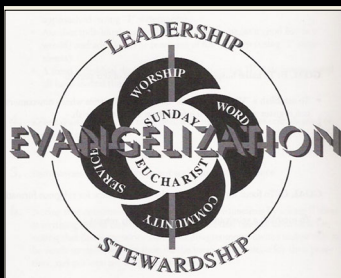

The Sacrament of Penance is a Sacrament of Healing because it celebrates the proclamation of Divine Mercy, the grace that comes with being renewed in our relationship with Almighty God and His People. It heals a broken relationship; it makes the penitent one again with the community. The sacrament “happens” because grace, a relationship, happens. The result of the sacrament is joy, the joy of receiving the Good News of “peace” that is, new life be in you. The Sacrament of Penance is an opportunity to experience a “favorable time” with the Lord – a moment in God’s time. The word for that is *kairos* which is the name of a retreat experience that many of our members who attend Roman Catholic high schools experience. Do you experience “joy” or a “favorable time” when you celebrate the Sacrament of Penance? At the heart of every community is forgiveness. Do you experience forgiveness, one way the community grows, at the Sacrament of Penance?

If you find the sacrament difficult for yourself, this sacrament can be difficult for the priest. We priests don’t want any penitent to leave the confessional with disgust or discouragement: “Father, I came here expecting to find Jesus. That person is not alive in your confessional.” Penance is a virtue that the priest in the dark room of the confessional must also practice! We priests cannot think of those who come to us as a group of sinners only. As we welcome sinners, we must celebrate their sorrow for sin with the joy that is an encounter with Christ. Jesus is the “Prince of Peace” and the “Healer of Souls” - it is Jesus whom the penitent encounters in the person of the priest in the confessional.

Before you approach the confessional, begin the celebration of the sacrament with an examination of your conscience. How have you said “no” to a relationship with God, other people, and how have you, in some deliberate way, contributed to “the deterioration of our common home,” Mother Earth, (see *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis)? Can you identify your sin?

The formation of your conscience is essential. Regardless of any code of law, can you identify any time when you made a choice for evil, a decision to do wrong? What did you do and what did you fail to do? Review the Beatitudes and the virtues. Did you not love or serve others as Jesus commanded? Did you harm the reputation of someone? When have you not been a person of integrity? Basically, the moral life is within us, it is written on our soul. Are you sorry for your sin?

The next act is to be greeted in the confessional. The priest, confessor, greets the penitent: “In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.” The penitent tells the priest that he wishes to be blessed, because he has sinned. Then he indicates how long it has been since his last confession. (I’m using the masculine pronoun only to avoid the he/she or his/her construction. Women folk sin and require confession too! I hope you are laughing now, it indicates you are reading and thinking!)

Now is the time to tell your sins to the priest. Okay, ask the question: “Why do I have to name my sins aloud to a priest? Why can’t I just admit sin to God and get on with my life? God alone forgives sin anyway, right? Do I have to do this face-to-face or can I go behind the screen anonymously?”

Is this a question or a complaint or an embarrassment – or the reason you don’t go to confession?

One answer is that all sin is in some sense an act against a community. Therefore, it takes a representative of the community to forgive the sin and reconcile the sinner to the community. Sin was a choice to diminish the self and the community both, by the mercy of God (through the prayer of absolution spoken by the priest) the sinner is restored.

The effect of this sacrament is forgiveness and the return to a community. It was Jesus who told the sinner: “Go and avoid this sin.” He meant “your choice to act as you did cut you from the community. Your choice to recall the act as a sin and confess it has restored you, through the mercy of my Father, to your community. Go, join them once more. Avoid your bad choice.”

Another answer to “why private confession and naming of sin before a priest” is the bishop is the minister of the sacrament. The bishop participates directly in apostolic succession. The priest, at his ordination, received his authority from the bishop. It was to the apostles, and Peter first among them, that Jesus spoke: “Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive men’s sins, they are forgiven them, if you hold them bound they are held bound.” John 20: 22-23. (Today’s gospel passage)

On this Pentecost Day – receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. As I have asked before, pray for the gift of courage; it has been called the primary gift/virtue. Pray for the courage to magnify/ glorify God by the way you live your life. Especially in the month of May, as Mary prayed all her life, may our lives and souls “magnify the Lord.” Go, glorify the Lord by the way you live your life! Alleluia! Alleluia!

THE FULLNESS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The church wakes up to an amazing message this morning. **Look around and see who has been called!** Listen to the voices of those who proclaim Jesus is Lord. You’ll find no race of people left out; you’ll find no language on earth unfit to proclaim the glory of God. We call Pentecost Sunday the “birthday of the church.” In many ways, the church is still being born. Only when we all know the peace Jesus offered in today’s Gospel will we really know the fullness of the Holy Spirit.

St. Paul assures us in today’s second reading that “all of us have been given to drink of the one Spirit.” When we look around us in the church we should see everyone. But we don’t. Not yet. What is holding us back from fully embracing the one Body of Christ? When will we see our differences as manifestations of the same Holy Spirit? Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

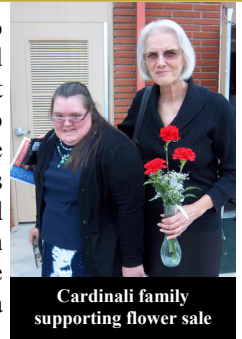

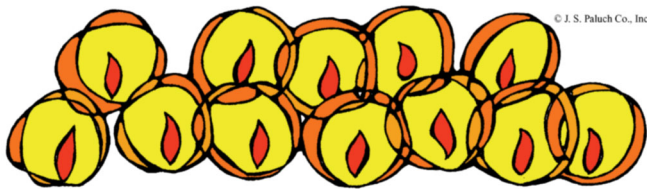

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

May 15, 2016

Solemnity of Pentecost

Announcing the *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis challenged us to proclaim God's mercy "to everyone without exception . . . again and again, with new enthusiasm and renewed pastoral action" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 12). Pentecost proclaims that the door locked for fifty days is thrown open at last. No longer closed in on itself, the community speaks to crowds from different backgrounds, distant lands, exotic languages. Everyone hears their native language. The Spirit does not restore Babel's uniformity, but forges unity-in-diversity of language, race, nationality—embracing all without exception. During this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pentecost's Spirit summons us afresh from mediocrity and isolation to share God's mercy with the world. "This is our mission!" Francis exclaims. We are "given the gift of the 'tongue' of the Gospel and the 'fire' of the Holy Spirit, so that while we proclaim Jesus risen, living and present in our midst, we may warm . . . the heart of the peoples, drawing near to Him, the way, the truth, and the life" (*Regina Coeli* address, Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2015).
