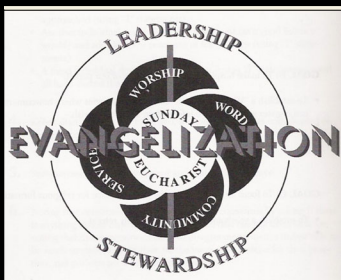

Marriage class continued, Lesson VII

After Joe and Mary left the parish offices, they had dinner with Dominic and Claire Marie whom they met at their Engaged Encounter Weekend. Mary was still all in a tizzy because she was told to follow the wedding guidelines at St. Dismas Parish and could not have all of the elements of the wedding ceremony she dreamed about. Dominic and Claire had greater difficulties.

When Fr. McTavish was at St. Anthony the Hermit Parish and was preparing them, he asked Claire Marie about her family name: Whipple. She told Fr. McTavish that she was the daughter of Chase Whipple who owns Whipple car dealerships statewide. Then Dominic volunteered how difficult his future father-in-law made life for him. "In what way has he caused you problems?" asked Fr. McTavish. "Oh, father! You don't know the half of it! You know, he (Chase Whipple) is a big Delta Tau Delta fraternity brother. McTavish continued. Dominic responded, "Father, when you asked us those questions from the Prenuptial Investigation, I responded that I am entering giving myself to Claire Marie. "Well, Dominic it means, you are not freely entering a lasting relationship if there are conditions for ending it, especially legally binding conditions should the marriage not last. 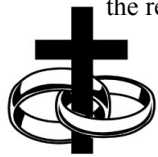

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY

August 14, 2016 Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This *Jubilee Year of Mercy* bids us share our own experience of Jesus' mercy with those on what Pope Francis calls the "peripheries"—people who feel marginalized, even unwelcome—inviting them to come home. But with all this mercy, why today's mayhem? "Do you think I have come to establish peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division" (Luke 12:51). Jesus "breaks down" those "breakups" in painful detail—parents, children, even in-laws. "Against" appears eight times in five verses. Jeremiah faced death for bearing witness (Jeremiah 38:4). Can't we bear at least a small share of the sometimes merciless cost of sharing mercy? The Letter to the Hebrews warns us, keep your "eyes fixed on Jesus" and "so great a cloud of witnesses," lest we "grow weary and lose heart" as we run "the race that lies before us" (Hebrews 12:1-3). After all, "for the sake of the joy that lay before him," Jesus "endured the cross" (12:2). Can't we endure our small crosses for the sake of sharing mercy?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

(RCIA), is a process developed by the Catholic Church for prospective converts to Catholicism who are above the age of infant baptism. Candidates are gradually introduced to aspects of Catholic beliefs and practices.

For those who join a RCIA process it is a period of reflection, prayer, instruction, discernment, and formation. There is no set timetable and those who join the process are encouraged to go at their own pace, taking as much time as they need.

Those who enter the process are expected to begin attending Mass on Sunday, attend a weekly RCIA session, and become increasingly involved in the activities of their local parish.

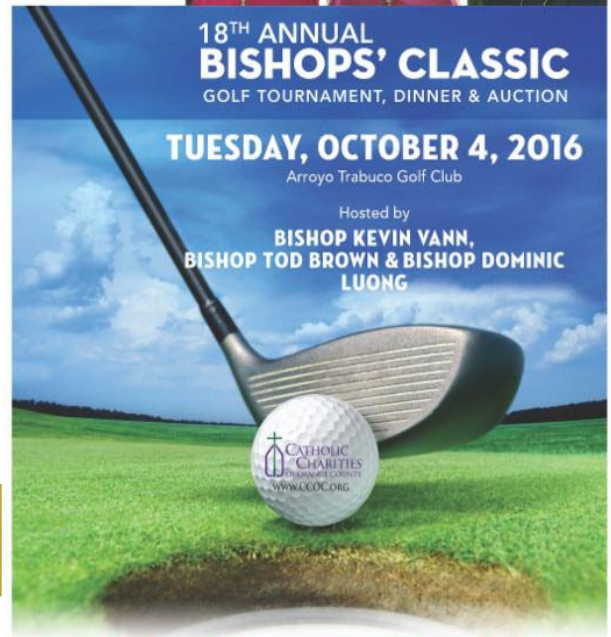
