





~ A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. ~



Let's return to the Sacraments at the Service of Communion and Mission which are Matrimony and Holy Orders. There are two important questions that we as humans ask ourselves: "Who am I?" and "How do I fit in?" Those two have siblings: "With whom will I share my life?" and "What does it all mean?" Whether one is single, married, or in some consecrated service to the Church, these are significant.

Answer the question: "With whom will I share my life?" and you are either single, married, or at the service of the Church. Oscar was an old forty-one when he married Mildred, herself thirtyeight. Both had never married. Oscar was becoming a confirmed bachelor; set in his ways one might say, had an eccentric whim about him - he was quite comfortable with his "life-style." Professionally he is a lawyer. He had dated seriously. He had good, even moral, relations with women. Mildred just never married. She was always single. She had an enjoyable "life-style" herself. Professionally she is also a trial attorney. The two met as members of the "Bar Association."

Their relationship grew strong and they married.

"What will it mean?" Each realized they will be joyful sharing life together; no longer alone, their lives will take on new meaning. It gives them community, for most, a family. It also gives each one responsibility for the other.

The last sacrament to be considered in our course is the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Like Matrimony, Holy Orders contributes to the building up of the Church community. This sacrament enables the ordained to exercise a "sacred power in the name and with the authority of Christ for the service of the People of God." (Catechism of the Catholic Church)

Notice that the sacrament is called Holy Orders –orders, a plural word. What are the orders? The orders are; first diaconate, then the priesthood, and following priesthood the order of bishop. The bishop is the "fullness of the sacrament of Holy Orders" - he is a legitimate successor of the Apostles. Bishops ordain deacons and priests. The bishop, as the "Chief Shepherd" of a diocese is the "visible head and foundation of unity for the diocese." He is assisted in this ministry by deacons and priests.

The primary, in the sense that it is the first, order is deacon. Each deacon, everyone who receives Holy Orders, is ordained for service to the People of God, which is the Church. Recall that the apostles were burdened by their many tasks that they asked for helpers. In this way the order of deacon began. Today deacons serve the Church by assisting bishops and priests in the celebration of the Mass, bringing Holy Communion to those who cannot be at Mass, assisting at marriages, baptisms, and funerals, the proclamation of the Gospel as well as preaching, and dedicating themselves to many ministries of charity.

Priests are "co-workers of the episcopal order (bishops)." The ordained priest serves (ministers) to the People of God by teaching, divine worship, and pastorally governing.

With Holy Orders the questions might be answered: "With whom will I share my life?" – The People of God. "What does it all mean?" The pursuit of holiness.

In the end, live your life so as to glorify the Lord – whether single, married, or in service to the Church, be His disciple. Wasn't Sr. Mary's talk last Sunday a good example?

The St. Juliana Fall Festival is coming quickly! Thank you, John and Maureen Kohaut for the gift you are to our community. 




