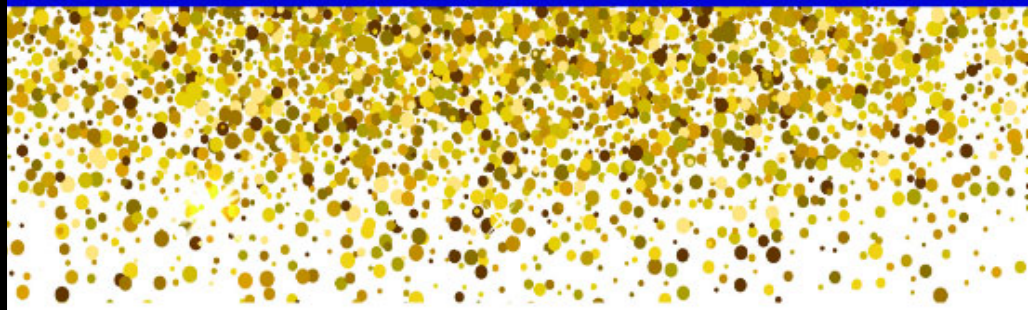
The vision of St. Juliana Falconieri Catholic Community is to live as a people of God with Christ at the center of our lives through liturgy, faith formation and community.

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

We live in the shadows of both Disneyland and Hollywood. Our home is between the imagination which made the Magic Kingdom and Tinsel Town. Yet most of us live our lives as if we are strict Public Accounts who abide by the strict categories of GAAP, “Generally Accepted Accounting Principles” than theologians who use the language of “creative imagination.” More often than not we refer to a catechism with its answers to teach the faith more than the Gospels with their lessons which cause even the Pope to scratch his head and ask, *with wonder*: “How do I make that scene/miracle which happened long ago and in a faraway place meaningful today?” Remember what Hamlet taught us: “There are more things in Heaven and Earth, Horatio, than are dreamt of in your philosophy.”

Hollywood is full of stars. Many times we approach it *with wonder*. Have you bought a map to their homes or grave sites? Their names fill stars along Hollywood Boulevard. (One Servite used to call it: The Boulevard of Broken Dreams – refer to the St. Tony Bennet version.) Mike Trout, a Los Angeles Angel of Anaheim baseball player is arguably THE star of major league baseball. It’s hard to believe anything so good can come out of New Jersey! He fills many *with wonder* as in “I wonder how much longer until he is a New York Yankee.”

I have fond memories of meals at my best friend’s home. The table setting included educational place mates – under our plates was either a map of the world, or the United States with capital cities, or the US with only outlines of States and we had to name them, or the US President (which ended with Richard Nixon’s first term), or the constellations in the sky with major stars named.

Sometimes it’s all about the stars. Our imagination creates the life of a Hollywood star to be much better, more glamorous and larger in every way than my insignificant life. They live in mansions and their tombs are visited. Along the boulevard we see the name, then call out the movie, sing the song, and recall the broadcast. The life of the sports star is also a creation, youngsters run for autographs and admire the human figure. A shooting star begins Disneyland’s evening fireworks.

Today we celebrate the feast of stargazers and the legends that have grown up around them. They are the ones who discovered Jesus – THE STAR, the light of heaven, the beginning of a whole new show, and the hero of the Ages. Of them we are told not much. Apart from a song, nothing of significance says they were kings, we are not told they came in a group of three (you wouldn’t want to buy more than three of them from Lladro, would you?) not a hint that one was white, another oriental, and the third black, their names are unknown, we call them Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.

These journeymen demonstrate what happens when the True Star is followed. They show us that Jesus did not come only for the poor, illiterate, or working Jewish shepherds. He also came for the rich, the educated, he came for Gentiles and pagans – without regard for race or national origin or skin pigmentation, language, or food choice; Jesus came for all people. Unarguably, Jesus is an equal opportunity redeemer.

These three stars realize the truth of Jesus, it’s not only what we have to offer, it is what he offers us; acceptance, forgiveness, and resurrection. These gifts are available to anyone who believes and they are worth seeking.

These men are like us: latecomers to know Jesus. They give up something to make a journey. Like us they are confused yet they seek real knowledge. They also receive the gift of life in abundance only when they overcome themselves and become liberated from indifference or self-righteousness or hedonist tendencies.

While some are following a star to the Playboy Mansion, others to Angel Stadium, still others to a telescope, these men are directing themselves and us to the place where Jesus is. To do so they tug at our soul-strings, they open our eyes to human beings around us, they invite us to give and accept what we receive.

Completing the manger scene they tell us that Jesus is less fastidious in his expectations than the catechism and Canon Law lead us to believe. Their faith directed their journey to eternity.

The manger is complete now. Hey, you! Wanna jump into the crib? It doesn’t take that much – some imagination is required. Come to the crib *with wonder* today. Come to the manger before it is put away for another year. Breathe in, way in, more in. Hold your breath. Don’t let all that air out at the same time. Come to the crib, it makes you wonder why others would just walk following another star. If you don’t leave singing: “We Three Kings” – might you leave singing: “The Impossible Dream” and “follow that star no matter how hopeless, no matter how far.”

Beginning today, follow what leads you to Jesus. He has room for you, because you are his from your baptism. Beginning today, experience fully the life Jesus won for you. Don’t do it alone, the wise didn’t either. Bring your family and friends, bring someone who is different. Together let us journey toward our salvation.

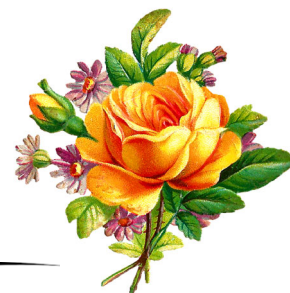

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

This year, in the United States the celebration of the Epiphany falls on January 8, but the traditional date for the Epiphany is January 6. The date we know as January 6 was established as the solstice in Egypt in 1996 BC, but the Egyptian calendar lost a full day every 128 years. Twenty centuries later the actual solstice had migrated to December 25. People still kept January 6 for the solstice celebration, but December 25, matching nicely with the Roman pagan feast of the Unconquered Sun, launched an extended solstice holiday. By the time of the early church, the whole period of twelve days was celebrated just about everywhere.

Christians began to celebrate Christ as the true light of the world in four themes: the Nativity, the manifestation to the Gentiles, the baptism of the Lord, and the wedding feast at Cana. That was entirely too much for one day to handle. A twelve-day season was ready to be adapted, so Christians borrowed from the pagan calendar for their own season of light. Thus early Christian celebrations of the Christmas season extended from one date for the solstice, December 25, to the older date, January 6. The darkest time in the Northern Hemisphere could now be filled with the Christian observance of the arrival of the Light of the World.
