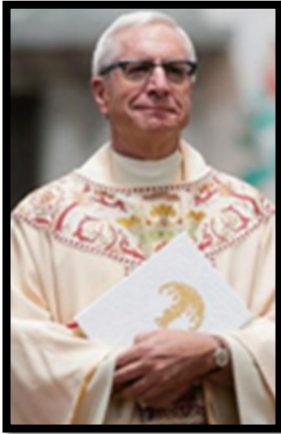

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

November, from start to finish is a glorious month. It begins with All Saints Day, All Soul's Day follows, Thanksgiving Day comes along, and then suddenly we prepare the way of the Lord to enter again at Christmas. It's a month that allows us to notice the way we are on the path to holiness even sainthood. Will we make it through the last toll booth: the gate of heaven? During this month, pause and notice what a difference each of us makes in our community, the gift to a community that each one of us is. Recall the stories of our friends, laugh, cheer, celebrate life! Really remember, make present in your mind, those who have gone before us, it is on their shoulders we stand when we celebrate All Soul's Day. Pause and prayerfully give thanks to God for His blessings upon us on Thanksgiving Day.

This month gives us an opportunity to remember, to celebrate, and to believe. We have an opportunity to receive God's love and to extend that love to others. Our receiving and our giving are incredible responses. Accepting and giving away are powerful gestures. There is an option; selfishness.

As friends and examples of Jesus we make a conscious decision – an act of belief - to be an expression of Jesus' love. It's our mission. It's the answer to: "Who am I and how will I fit in with the 'communion of the saints?'"

Every one of us has a mission. Because we are believers, each of us has a mandate to receive and extend the love of Jesus – the service of Christ - to raising all people to a new hope.

To do this "we must diminish and Jesus must increase." In short, we have to "get over ourselves" and live for others. Turn away from selfishness, entitlement, and self-centeredness and turn toward service of others, form a community of believers who act as Jesus acted.

No family is simply a collection of sovereign individuals who share the same roof, refrigerator, cooling and heating system, and argue for spots in the garage or driveway. The mission of parents is to raise children to be responsible adults who care for one another.

The Church's mission is to raise a community of saints for the Kingdom of God. Recognize that all of us are good, God made us for Him, we belong to Him. Recognize your life as God's handiwork. Share that life with others. The sharing of your life is the sharing of an incredibly good gift.

Make a conscious decision to be followers of Jesus Christ as an expression of discipleship. Change your life by practicing what you believe. What commitment will you make as to live as a good steward of this community of faith?

After we say "I believe," turn away from yourself and become the Body of Christ.

Go, and proclaim the Good News by the way you live your life.

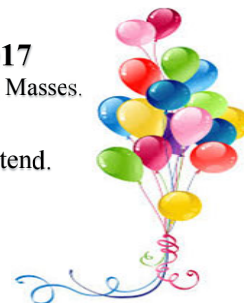

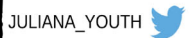

Basilica of St. John, the Lateran



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

What is the name of the pope’s cathedral? If you said the Vatican, or St. Peter’s, you were off by a few miles, since the answer is the Basilica of St. John, the Lateran, the “Mother Church” of all the churches of the world and the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome. It takes its name from the Lateran family, the Trumps of their day, who somehow ran afoul of the Emperor Nero. He seized all their property, including their vast Roman palace and estate. We don’t know how Plautius displeased Nero so badly, but eventually all the Lateran property came to Constantine, the first Christian emperor, through his wife, Fausta. Early in the fourth century, when Christianity was at last legalized, Constantine gave the property to the church. Soon the great meeting halls were expanded and adapted.

Over the centuries, the church building has been sacked by armies, ruined by fire, torn down, and rebuilt. The oldest and most unchanged part of the Lateran is a vast, separate baptistery with steps leading down to a huge green basalt pool. Imagine what a triumphal moment the dedication of this public church building was for a community that had worshiped in secret for so long! This Thursday’s feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica is really about the tradition of consecrating space for worship, and so by extension, a feast for your parish church building and, given the beautiful second reading, for its baptistery as well.

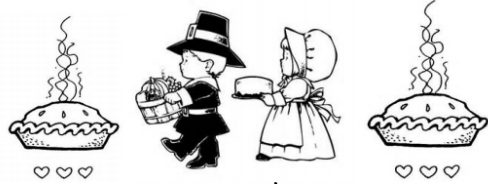

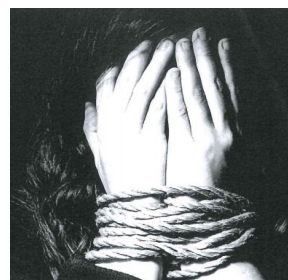

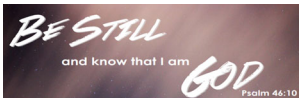
