NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

How do you celebrate waiting?

What do you do when you are expecting?

How do or did you wait for your child – during pregnancy? How do you wait for the Messiah?

Nifty questions, each of them.



Advent is a season of waiting. Our whole religious and spiritual life is really one l-o-n-g Advent season. Jesus, the savior has been born. Jesus has preached, worked miracles, suffered, and died. God has raised Christ from the dead. So, what are you waiting for? We are awaiting the Second Coming of Jesus, not the birth of Jesus in the manger for the first time. Christmas remembers that Jesus was born. Faithfully we await the return of our Savior. This Advent and our whole faith journey, we wait for the adult Jesus.

There must be some art to waiting. It's called patience. Mostly, I dislike waiting. When I make a restaurant table reservation for 7:30PM, I expect the table to be ready at 7:30PM or close to it. I know their trick: "Your table isn't ready, sir. Would you like to wait in our bar?" Answer this way: "Not really, we don't drink." Funny, the table is ready lick-ity-split. When I have a doctor's appointment for 3:15PM, I expect to have my name called and be shown a room at 3:15PM or close to it. Usually isn't the case. After the appointment time, the nurse takes my blood pressure and remarks that it is elevated. Darn right it is! Try taking it at 3:15PM, before I started fuming, when it was lower!

Waiting is an art that our rather impatient age has forgotten. Perhaps long ago it was better. Today, the billboard signs broadcast, it seems months in advance, the opening of a new movie, the ribbon cutting of a new store, the first day of baseball. Waiting is torture. It began to look a lot like Christmas a week before the first Sunday of Advent. Wait.

What do you do when you are expecting a child, sibling, grand-child to be born? Take a trip back down memory lane. Will you (did you) raise the child of your dreams or your love? What will you (did you) discuss around your tables? Share the story of their births with your children. Don't raise your voice. Laugh and cry as spontaneity allows you.

For that which is profound we must wait. For the opening of the first rose in spring; wait. For the newborn; wait. Just you wait for the cute and cuddly new born to become a toddler, then first day of school, an adolescent, and an adult, finally. Just you wait for that moment when your child will come home tell you: "Mom and Dad – I've found someone I love even more than I love you!"

Advent is celebrated by those who wait patiently. It is also celebrated by those with restless souls who know no peace. They are the ones who know that they are incomplete and restless. They are the ones who sense someone who can set them free is coming.

The One who came and is coming is disguised. The Prince of Peace didn't come wearing a crown; he wasn't dressed with any indication of royalty. Present in clear sight, he was missed. Still is.

How should we wait? Try silence. In silence so you can listen to God. Even see Him. Don't sing, don't bang bells. Sit in silence. Let God have the first word of your day. Allow God to have the last word of your day. Your silence means you are waiting. Wait humbly for Jesus, the savior to make another connection with you.

Silence. "Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silent" – allow silence in your life. Much of what is necessary is unspoken. A lot of what is un-necessary is said aloud.

Celebrate the wait. Be aware that Jesus our savior is coming in all his glory. WOW! Wait in wonder. Oh, Silent Night.






