



Page Three A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M. March 26, 2017



Each day I give my parents thanks for having the good sense to have moved from Chicago to Orange County before I came along. I especially like to spend time at the Pacific Ocean, it calms me. And like John Denver, sunshine on my shoulders makes me happy. I am also grateful that Walt Disney founded Disneyland here. Both open my eyes wide.

Wide open eyes. That's what this Sunday's Gospel lesson is all about.

I have an annual pass to Disneyland, I grew up about two miles from "THE HAPPIEST PLACE ON EARTH." I worked there for three years, until I was fired – non-re-hire-ably so. (Don't ask!) I get good use out of my pass. Often I just sit along Main Street and listen to the chap play his piano. I also watch parents and kids beginning or ending their day. The interaction or lack of it is often an eye-full. "Daddy! Look!" the kid with saucer eyes screams when he finds an intriguing creation of the "Imagine-ears." "If we stop now, we won't get to Splash Mountain" replies the dad as he tugs his youngster down Main Street without any care for his son's

adventure into fantasy. The kid stops, resolutely, unbendingly, and cries big buckets of tears. That's when the parent really sees the child and his amazement. That's when the boy becomes more important than Splash Mountain, the time of day, or even the admission fee. Wisely, then they stand, hand-in-hand, and notice the magic. And a whole lot more; the gift of fatherhood and son-ship.

If most of us could find just ten or fifteen minutes a day, out of the whirlwind of demands, time to *really* see what's *really* important, I bet there'd be fewer divorces, less cheating, fewer unwanted pregnancies, less racism, fewer wars, less criticism, more acceptance, and louder laughter.

As George tells Lenny in *Of Mice and Men*, "It's not wicked people that cause the problems. It's *dumb* people." And truer words were never spoken.

Shouldn't the Christian tempt all people to open their eyes, to freely see and freely do the truth? To live life in a sanctified way? Do it whenever the unpredictable arises. Not because Christians have all the answers in a book, but because they have the way to think embedded in their minds and the need to be decent embedded in their hearts. **That** *is* the glory of God: Humankind fully alive.


Basically, it doesn't matter what you stop to see before you get to Splash Mountain.

CHILDREN OF THE LIGHT

The future king, David, in today's first reading, is an example of a type of character present throughout the Hebrew scriptures. He is the child born out of place (not the eldest or most favored) who ends up receiving the promise of the covenant. The spirit of God's anointing rushes upon him. In this way, he is similar to the man born blind from today's Gospel. David's family and the blind man's community did not expect the miraculous grace of God's love to work through them. Perhaps they, too, were "blinded" by the expectations and assumptions of those around them. Yet, after being touched by God, they both came to "see" the presence of God's will for them. Both became messengers of God's will. That same Spirit of God's anointing rushed upon us at our baptism; we were given a candle as a sign of our membership in the Body of Christ, the Light from Light. MORE CORAZON NEWS


