A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

Hard work pays off! Hard work, steady progress, pays off!

THE DEBT ON THE PARISH CENTER IS PAID OFF! Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

At its regular meeting last Thursday, April 27, the Parish Finance Council determined that we had enough cash on hand to make the final payment - ahead of schedule (avoiding further interest fees) - on the loan of \$4,000,000 from the Diocese of Orange. On Friday, April 28, the last business day of the month, the final payment was sent to the Diocese of Orange! The Parish Center loan is completely paid! At any time, but especially during Easter - **ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA!**

A note from the Diocese to St. Juliana Parish was drafted on May 1, 2007 loaning St. Juliana \$4,000,000, to be repaid with interest beginning on June 1, 2007 and continuing until the loan is paid in full with the final payment coming April 20, 2022. That date came sooner, rather than later – **HARD WORK PAYS OFF LOANS.**

Read this good news: **“ALLELUIA” – “You, dear parishioners and friends of St. Juliana have enabled the business office to make the final payment on the Parish Center. You did it ahead of schedule! Your hard work paid off the Parish Center! A mountain of thanks and a sea of prayers go to each of you.”**

Burn the mortgage! Let’s celebrate. A date and event will be planned.

A BIT OF HISTORY: In October 2000, this parish and school embarked upon a capital campaign to renew the entire plant. Phase one of this campaign was the renovation of the school buildings which involved seismic retrofitting, new roof, painting, air-conditioning, and other up-grades. That cost was \$1.8M. For a parish school built in 1958, ours is well kept and in good shape. We are proud of the students and their school building! Thank you!

Rectory garages, the St. Vincent de Paul Center (\$500K), various campus improvements (\$450K), and Parish Center building were all completed by 2009. Our parishioners, school students, families, friends, and visitors find the facilities useful and well kept. We are proud! Thank you!

In all, more than \$10,450,000 has been raised and paid for by you and your predecessors. Remember to add in interest fees and the cost of raising the capital. The projects began with Fr. Jude and continued with Fr. Luke and Fr. Frank. Diocesan guidance came from Bishop Tod Brown and the staff at the Diocese of Orange. Also to be thanked are development – advancement - campaign chairs and their committees. We are grateful currently to Mr. Curtis Wesseln and his ministry of advancement and directing stewardship. We thank the office staff for their ministry and support.

Lately, our church structure has been reroofed and seismically retrofitted. The systems – HVAC – were serviced. The inside has been enhanced with new flooring, pews, paint, sound system update, and a few other touches. The project is not complete. Individual donors have funded the sound system and the mosaic design on the floor in the church aisle way. Thank you!

The front entry from Melody Lane to the church is on an architect’s table right now. What began as a project to “change out the front doors” has developed into “re-model the Melody Lane entry.” I will show you the architect’s proposal once it is agreed to by the Parish Finance Committee, Pastoral Council, and Diocese of Orange. I do have some good news regarding its funding. A parishioner gave this community an initial \$50K for the project. Not long ago at a restaurant I met a couple who come to daily Mass – they are non-parishioners. They complimented the church but asked about the front doors. I explained that the project grew from what I originally intended and as the project grew so did its cost. I’m stressing over the project; what was going to cost about \$50K and was paid for is now about \$150K, most of that is without funding. Without hesitation: “Father, we will give St. Juliana \$50K!” WOW! Alleluia x 3! Thank YOU!” **I offer us all a challenge – can we match the \$50K gift?**

The debt on the church enhancement project owed to the Diocese today is \$135K. Our community has been generous. Are you meaning to make a financial contribution?

When the church enhancement project is completed, a donor plaque will be posted with thanks and prayers.

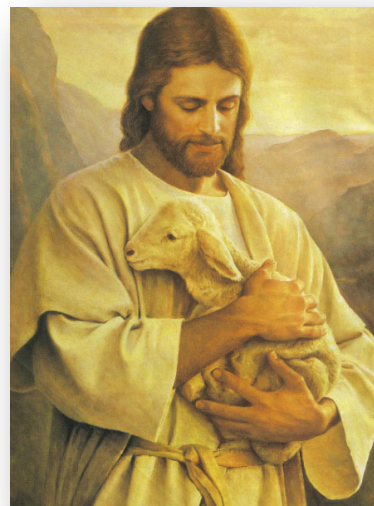

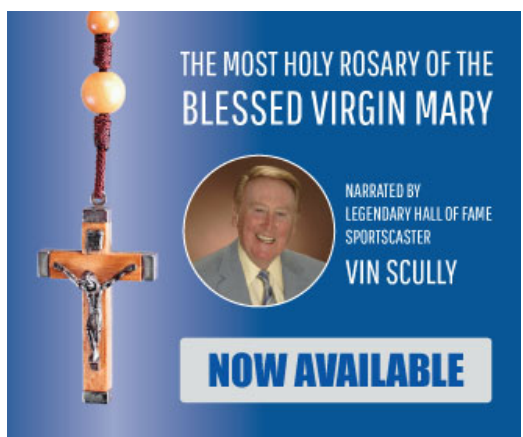
