




THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

As we celebrate the Great National Holiday of Independence Day – I encourage you to pause and consider its meaning and effects. The Founding Fathers of our Great Nation found it necessary to "dissolve political bands" that connected them to another country.

Our original thirteen American colonies became independent and sovereign states freeing themselves from the Rule of King George III of Great Britain. The Second Continental Congress formed a new nation, The United States of America.

I sometimes wonder, even in fear, if we Americans have taken the notion of independence a bit too far. Of course it's best to be set free from tyranny and that which harms basic human existence. Yet we do depend on each other. Humans are best when we seek not independence but inter-dependence. I need you and you

are best when we seek not independence but inter-dependence. I need you and you need me. John Donne's poem reminds us quite correctly: "No man is an island entire of itself; every man is a piece of the continent..."

An image of the strong American is the cowboy riding off into the sunset alone. He rode first to some place that wasn't OK, made it Ok, and returned home, a solitary man. With a six-shooter on his belt and a rifle in his saddle bag, his force made things OK.

In the late 1960s extending through the 1970s *I'm OK- You're OK* was a popular self-help book for creating and mending relationships. OK is a status that a relationship achieves after going through some rough stages of I'm not OK – you aren't OK, I'm not OK - you are OK, I'm OK-You aren't OK, and finally I'm OK-You are OK- I forget if there is any set order. OK?

Rather than a ride into the sun-set alone, independent of all others, work on relationships that build up a community – most especially the community called Church. St. Paul wrote that we are the "Body of Christ" each person a necessary part of it (see I Cor. 12: 12-31; Rom.12: 3-18). I am OK and you are OK, together we make up the Church. Together we fit in the community and are part of the Body of Christ. The lyrics of a popular hymn tell us: "We are One Body, One Body in Christ and we do not stand alone."

Be inspired and encouraged to live the three charisms (spiritual gifts) of St. Juliana the patroness of this Catholic Community in Fullerton. They are identified in the mission and vision statements of the parish as **community**, the **Eucharist**, and **faith formation**.

As a community we depend on each other and special roles (ministries) that make us one. If you are an Usher (hospitality) minister, Extra-Ordinary minister of Holy Eucharist, Lector (reader), or Altar server – we depend on you! If you are assigned to be present at a Mass, please be present. Dress appropriately for your leadership role and be at the Mass at least fifteen minutes prior to its start. If you cannot be present, please find a substitute or ask someone who can find a substitute for you. If you would like to be a minister, please make your intention known – we, I, will enjoy your service. If you graduated the eighth grade - please continue as an altar server. I'll be sure you have albs long enough – high school won't make you too old or too tall to serve! If there is some reason why you don't want to serve, might I know it?

The community depends on you to be present during Exposition (adoration) of the Blessed Sacrament on the first Tuesday of the month. St. Juliana inspires us, her community, to imitate her devotion to the Holy Eucharist. Please sign up and keep your time. It is important that we have at least two people praying at all times during the twenty-four hours of Exposition. Your prayer will be a benefit to you and us.

Faith formation is also a gift. Parents, please see that your children are enrolled and participating in faith formation classes – either in the parish grammar school or School of Religious Education (SRE) – teens I am encouraged by your attendance and participation in the programs available for you. Adults, come to what is offered. Bring family, friends, and food!

On this Independence Day weekend – don't be independent or removed from the life of your faith community – we depend on each other. At St. Juliana, we are all OK! As James Joyce described the Catholic community – HERE COMES EVERYBOY! "Summoned by the God who made us rich in our diversity, gathered in the name of Jesus, richer still in unity – Let us bring the gifts that differ and in splendid varied ways, sing a new church into being, one in faith and love and praise" – Sing a New Church! (#830).

There will be one festive Mass on July 4th at 9:00AM. Might the sporting events and family picnic in the park right across the street begin AFTER Mass?

THANK YOU, THANK YOU – to everyone who planned, cooked, served, prepared, cleaned and CELEBRATED TOGETHER this marvelous parish as we shredded the loan document to the Diocese of Orange on June 24. THANK YOU, THANK YOU.

Fr. Damien Giap, O.Praem (Norbertine Community) who assists our parish on Saturday's with confessions and Mass celebrated his tenth anniversary of ordination on June 29. Thank you Fr. Damien for your life of ministry to word and sacrament and the Norbertine Community!




The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

For those who join a RCIA process it is a period of reflection, prayer, instruction, discernment, and formation. There is no set time table and those who join the process are encouraged to go at their own pace, taking as much time as they need.

Those who enter the process are expected to begin attending Mass on Sunday, attend a weekly RCIA session, and become increasingly involved in the activities of their local parish.

RESPECT LIFE NEWS PENNIES FROM HEAVEN

St. Juliana Parish will again this year, support the Diocesan Baby Bottle *PENNIES FROM HEAVEN C*OLLECTION. In our parish the campaign starts on August 12 & 13 with the hand-out of the baby bottles after all Masses and the bottles to be returned two weeks later on August 26 & 27 with your donation of coins, paper money or checks. All the proceeds go to fund the annual operational costs of these 12 facilities in Orange County that provide free services for pregnant women in need and their babies:

The three shelters, *Casa Teresa, Mary's Shelter (see info below) and the Precious Life Shelter.

The six Obria full service women's medical clinics.

The two Life Centers, Santa Ana and La Habra.

The Horizon Pregnancy Clinic and the Vietnamese Hot Line.

(Contact information for all these services are on a poster in the vestibule.) In the next few weeks leading up to the *Pennies From Heaven* baby bottle hand-out, we will highlight information on one of these facilities each week.

*Information about CASA TERESA

CASA TERESA is located in Orange and has been helping mothers and babies for years. They provide a temporary home for women <u>over 18</u>, who have chosen life for their baby. They offer parenting skills or adoption services for the women who do not want to keep their baby. 
