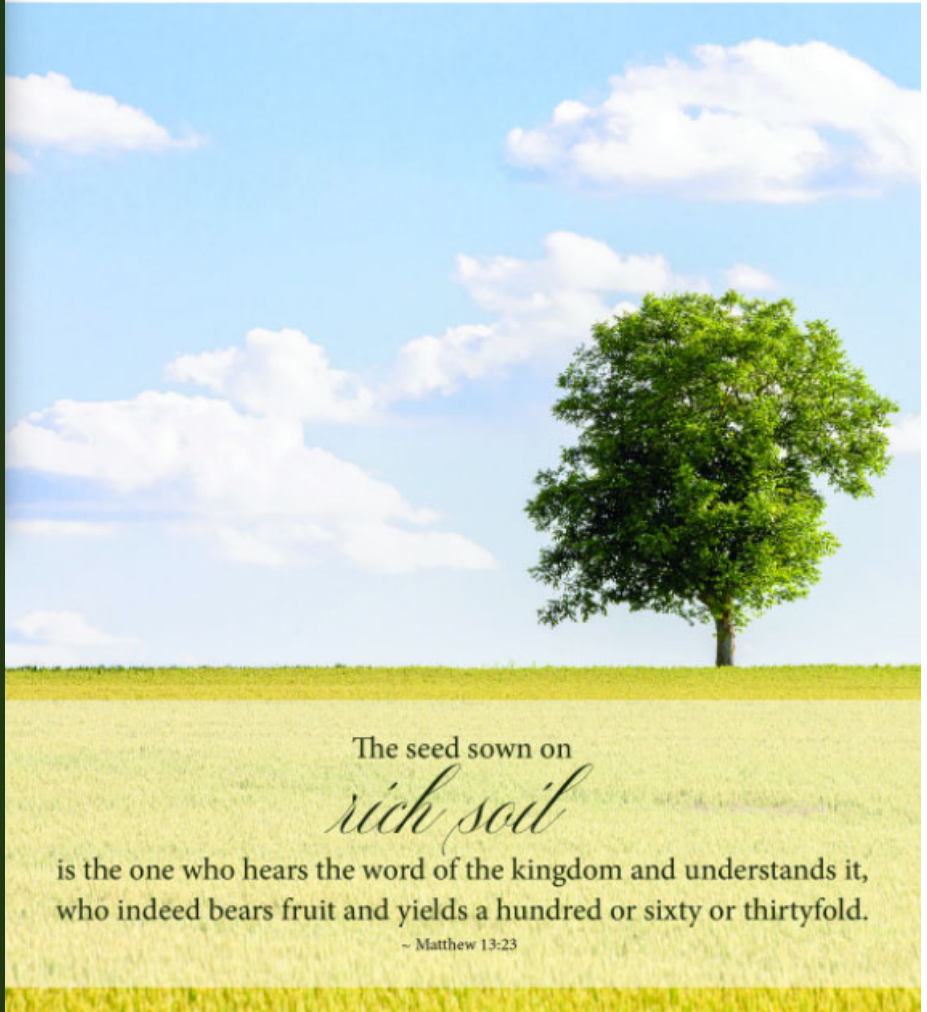

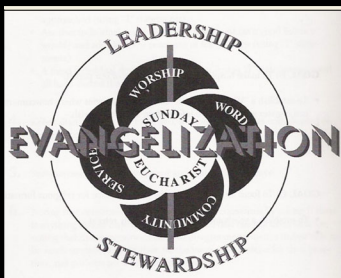

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

You, St. Juliana Falconieri Catholic Community, have accomplished A LOT in the past few years. You have enhanced old buildings, built new ones, and fully paid off a debt for this progress, five years early! St. Juliana Catholic Grammar school is on solid footing because of the wisdom of your planning to enhance its buildings and set strong strategy for its future. The school's administration, faculty, staff and dedicated volunteers work hard and sacrifice what could be a better life-style as they educate our younger members in the way of our Catholic faith and American society. The Catholic school exists for one purpose; to teach the next generation of our Church. In my opinion it does that very well.

Our newer buildings are lovely and purposeful. They too reflect sacrifice. You could have given your time, talent and treasures to other causes or your own personal pleasures.

The church building itself has been enhanced. It is freshly painted, we walk on new flooring, worship on new pews, hear by way of a new sound system, use new doors with easy access, and a few other details. A new entry will be proposed to you shortly; its plans are being drawn and commented on and refined by members of the Pastoral Council and a few other parishioners.

Followers of Jesus, as a faith community you should be proud of your status and success!

With all that has been accomplished let us not lose sight of the most significant status we have, the reason for our boasting - the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Word of Scripture, and the Most Holy Sacrament, our community's meal. As Christians our growth is always the growing pains of conversion; a life that means we are Christians, a redeemed people and members of the family of God. Our thinking, affections, and moral behavior must reflect our conversion to the Good News, the Gospel of Jesus, his single teaching: "The Kingdom of God is at hand."

Our real property is beautiful and kept well. Our faith expressed by our conversion to the Word, the Sacrament, and the Community of Christ must be the goal of our existence on and off of this property. It is spiritual intimacy with God that we seek as we grow in the mystery of who He is, what He is all about and how we will live with Him.

For the past several Sundays, today, and for a few more yet to be celebrated, the second reading is a continuous lesson from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans. St. Paul wrote the letter, his longest, (not his first - First Corinthians was before Romans) most likely from Corinth to Rome in about 57AD, some years before the 64AD fire in Rome and the beginning of Christian persecution by Nero. St. Paul is instructing, urging really, the Jews and goyim alike that the way to salvation - justification - is faith in Jesus. There is one way, one teaching, one master plan for life and a relationship with God. That comes when you meet God in Jesus and imitate him.

The demand of Christian conversion is that we turn 180° away from "the world, the flesh" to the Spirit "that dwells in you." Read flesh to mean: "our human condition without justification and with the conditions of sin." "The flesh in its tendency is at enmity with God." (The flesh is the presence of an enemy - the feeling of hostility toward God.) The Letter to the Romans is direct and decisive. Here is the heart of the matter: there is no justification without conversion to Jesus. To be alive is to "live as holy ones according to God's will."

Do not let the second reading escape you or your family by being back-ground noise in the Sunday readings. Although this Sunday, the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time cycle A, is a reading from chapter eight, go back and begin again with chapter five or even one. "You are justified by faith for the glory of God." "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." "I consider the sufferings of this present time as nothing compared to the glory to be revealed for us." That's a road map to conversion and salvation!

How do you keep the common cultural attitudes of the civil society from corrupting your religious life and its growth? What are the conflicts, as you live your Roman Catholic Christian faith and all of its ideals on the one hand, and your personal social, educational, political and etc. commitments and competing ideals on the other?

Vacation Bible School is this week - your children will benefit by its education, community, and just general fun. Are your children signed-up for the regular School of Religious Education? Do you or anyone you know wish to be converted to Catholicism through the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, or receive Holy Communion and Confirmation as an adult? 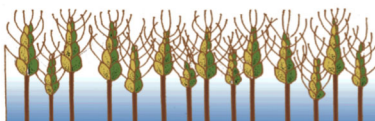

They provide many services for women including women in crisis pregnancy situations. They offer love, support, financial assistance, medical referrals, clothing, housing, education and much more. Their facilities have nurses on staff and an ultrasound machine. They offer STD testing and Abortion Reversal.

CREATED BY GOD Built For A Purpose

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA) - SESSIONS BEGIN IN AUGUST

For adults today, the Church, after the Second Vatican Council, has restored the order of the Catechumenate in the *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* (RCIA). It outlines the steps for the formation of catechumens (non-baptized persons), bringing their conversion to the faith to a greater maturity. RCIA helps them respond more deeply to **God's gracious initiative in their lives and prepares them for union with the Church community**. The RCIA process is meant to inform inquirers of the fullness of Christian life and to help them become disciples of Jesus, their teacher. This includes an initiation into the mystery of salvation, the practice of faith, hope, and love, and other virtues in a succession of liturgical rites.

Persons baptized into another Christian church and now seeking full communion with the Catholic Church are also welcomed to participate along with catechumens in RCIA, in the process of learning about the Catholic faith and being formed in our faith. They bring to the process of preparation their prior experience of Christian life and prayer. For a baptized Christian, reception into full communion with the Catholic Church involves reception of the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation and then a Profession of Faith in the Catholic Church followed by the celebration of Confirmation and the Eucharist.

- Has a child over the age of seven who has not been baptized?
- Was baptized Catholic as a child, but has not celebrated the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist?

St. Juliana Church offers you an opportunity to come together in a small group setting to learn more about our faith. Sessions focus on the teachings and experience of Church and will prepare individuals to celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist during the Easter season. There is a separate process for children or youth as well. You are welcome to participate in the process with your questions, your insights and your faith story in a warm accepting setting. 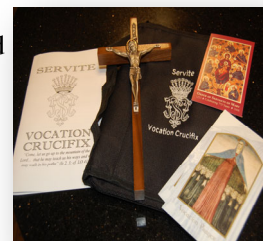

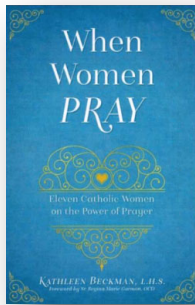
