A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

More morality – either Y-A-W-N or yippee. Last week I mentioned *A Man For All Seasons*; a play and a movie about the life of St. Thomas More. Without delay or pop-corn let's continue the course. I always wanted to provide the snack bar concession for teachers who show movies. A discussion is better.

Consider these quotes from *A Man For All Seasons*:

*Get someone to do your work for you.
Everyman has a price – in real money.*

*When statesmen forsake their own private
conscience for the sake of their public duties they
lead their country by a short route to chaos.*

*Being true to my own conscience,
I must rule myself.*

*By the law we know what is legal,
not what is right.*

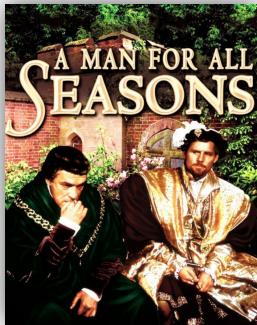
*Morality is not practical. It's a gesture.
A complicated gesture learned from books.*

I die the king's good servant, but God's first. (his last words)

*And when we stand before God,
and you are sent to Paradise
for doing according to your conscience,
and I am damned for not doing
according to mine, will you come with me,
for fellowship?*

*God more regards the thoughts of the heart than
the words of the mouth.*

*Well...finally...it isn't a matter of reason;
finally, it's a matter of love.*



One way to learn moral principles is through the canon of literature; “Morality is not practical. It’s a gesture. A complicated gesture learned from books”. *A Man For All Seasons* is a 1960 play written by Robert Bolt and a 1966 movie (Best Movie Academy Award). It’s about “King Henry VIII’s Great Matter” which began in 1527 during the reign of Pope Clement VII. Henry was married to Catherine of Aragon, his brother’s widow who did not bear him a son. He wished to have this marriage annulled so he could marry Anne Boleyn. Thomas More was the Lord Chancellor, that’s the highest judicial position of England. Both Henry and Thomas were Catholic. Following the Catholic Church, Thomas opposed the annulment. The “Great Matter” ended with the initiation of the English Reformation and the establishment of the Church of England. It also ended in Thomas More being imprisoned and beheaded. More is important precisely because of his resistance to pledge an oath of fidelity to King Henry, turning away from the Church. More would not capitulate.

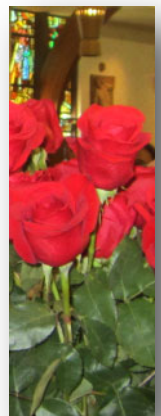
King Henry VIII forced an either/or choice upon Thomas More. Either Thomas follows his conscience and personal integrity or he had to forsake himself, his God, and Church. His death as a martyr was a heroic gesture in defense of his conscience. He refused to go against his formed conscience; he paid the price of his life, he could not be bought. His conscience was not for sale. Along with Martin Luther he could have said: “Here I stand, I can be no other. God help me!”

The lesson, maintaining personal integrity, is the lesson of acting on moral principles. As it was with Jesus on Good Friday, there is no sale price for one’s conscience, character, or personal integrity.

St. Thomas More’s (feast day June 21) own multiple writings reveal the many dimensions of moral principles. Reviewing some passages from the play alone we realize that the problems of More’s past remain difficulties of our present time.

Your assignment: Discuss the quotes from the play. Along with *A Man For All Seasons*, enjoy reading Thomas More’s own writings: *Utopia*, his letters, and a lot more. *In Praise of Folly* was dedicated to him by his good friend Erasmus. While its text was written in Latin, the title in Greek, *Moriae Encomium* is a pun on More’s name. We all need a little pun!

As we remember and celebrate ALL SOULS today and this month – AN ENORMOUS amount of THANKS goes to our BEREAVEMENT TEAM, our deacons and their wives, and our music ministry, and our office and facilities staff. What a great group of men and women you are! Dear parish - we have a very dedicated group who prepare a worthy reception, welcome all visitors, and clean the parish center for each funeral. The food which follows the homemade cakes is very good. There is a particular Jell-O salad that reminds me of my sainted mother. God bless all of you. If you can volunteer, to the Bereavement ministry, information is in the bulletin and office, you will be welcomed.
