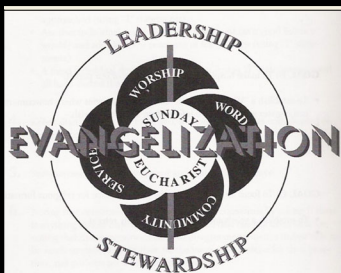

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M.

If you were given help to correct all that diminishes “life in abundance” – would you use it wisely? If mercy and love were offered to you – would you accept the gift?

Most folks believe they know God by knowing a definition of God. “God is the Supreme Being, infinitely perfect, who made all things and keeps them in existence.” (Baltimore Catechism)

Sweet! Whom do you seek? Certainly the “Supreme Being”, the One who is supremely different from all other beings. We seek a relational being. Not a force like gravity or just energy. Not a human creation, something of our own design or imagination, useful or not. Not a supreme conscience that “makes us” feel good when we do something good or bad when we do something bad. Not a **something** but a **someONE**. Have you considered the personality of this **ONE** lately?

Lent gives us time. Time to renew our relationship with God. Time to experience God.

Lent gives us time to “return to God” – to go home again, to feel the relationship that was lost when we were “ordinary”.

I’m fond of libraries. Libraries have amnesty moments when books can be returned without fines or fees. Countries, civil jurisdictions, have amnesty moments when fines and fees are forgiven. Until the amnesty period, I suppose (stupid me, I just pay the fine so I really don’t know) people hid books or whatever it is that they possess in guilt.

Actions are irreversible; when we speak or do an action, whether maliciously or with thought, the word or deed generates misunderstanding, distrust, hostility, alienation, and we pay for it forever and ever. There is no way out. (Well, some cultures have a way out - caution: it’s messy. Watch the three episodes of The Godfather and do not get back to me!) Most often the situation only gets worse, the hurt gets deeper.

Yet we ache to start anew.

That’s where Lent is so important. During Lent, meet God again. Meet The Living God – Jesus, again. Jesus (God) offers us another chance. Reforming our life during Lent gives us a chance to pursue life in abundance, life in the presence of God. The Gospel of Jesus is assurance that God is with us. What we cannot do by ourselves, God will help. Lent gives us a time to experience God’s mercy and love. Lent gives us a time to forgive and receive forgiveness; grace a relationship made whole.

The Church wants you to know the loving kindness of God – God who forgives, God who loves/serves. “Forgive us now each other’s faults as we our faults confess. And let us love each other well, in Christian holiness.” (Where Charity and Love Prevail #721).

How can we love God with all that is in us, if something or someone is in the way?

Accept this time of Lent to forgive as you have been forgiven.
 Accept this time of Lent to show mercy as you have been shown mercy.
 Accept this time of Lent to renew your relationship with God who is Love.

RCIA SCRUTINIES - INFO YOU MIGHT LIKE TO KNOW

The RCIA Scrutinies are very special rites celebrated on the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sunday's of Lent, at liturgies where the RCIA Elect are present. The Elect are those in our midst who are preparing for Baptism (at the great Easter Vigil). Part of their journey, to the font at Easter, is that they have been received among us (the Rite of Welcome and Acceptance), and they have been enrolled in the Book of the Elect (the Rite of Election). Now, during Lent, we celebrate three Scrutinies with our Elect, and continue to pray for them during their final preparations for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation).

Even if you are not at a Mass where these rites are celebrated, it can be wonderful to reflect upon the journey the Elect are making during Lent, as an inspiration and source of renewal for us in our journey.

These are ancient RCIA rites and they may, at first, seem strange to us. But they are profoundly rooted in our human experience. Now - during Lent - as we celebrate the Scrutinies, we need to examine (scrutinize) how we are, the areas of our lives where we are tempted, or seriously sin - in what we do and what we fail to do. We really need healing and the strength that can come from the support of our sisters and brothers.

Invitation to Silent Prayer

One of the most powerful moments of the Scrutinies is how they begin. After the homily, the Elect are invited to come forward with their sponsors. The whole assembly is invited to pray for them in silence. It is a very solemn moment. This community has cared for these Elect for some months now on their journey. We have sent them to reflect more and more deeply on the Word of God, and expressed to them our longing for the day on which they would join us at the table of the Lord. Now we pray for them in this sacred silence, deeply asking God to protect them and heal them in the weeks ahead.

Intercessions for the Elect

We then pray out loud together for the Elect.

Prayer of Exorcism

Then, we pray that they might be freed from the power of evil and protected on their journey.

The Laying On of Hands

In a silent ritual deliberately reminiscent of the rite used for ordination in the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the priest or deacon lays his hands for a brief moment on the head of each of the Elect. It is a solemn act of calling down the Spirit of Jesus to be with them and protect them.

Dismissal of the Elect

The Elect are then sent forth to reflect upon the Word and this powerful gesture of love on the part of this community, that cares for them so deeply, with the love of Christ.

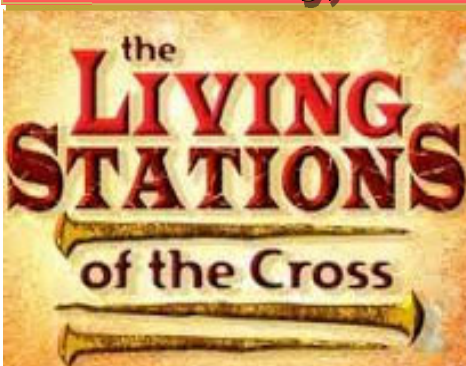
School tours will take place at 9:00am each Tuesday morning. Appointments are not required; just come by the office by 9:00am any Tuesday.

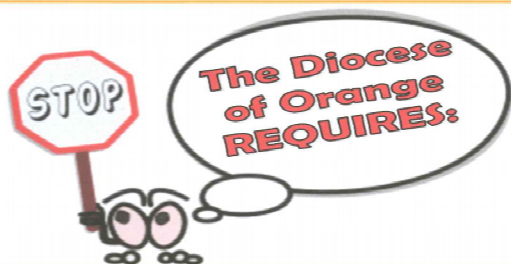

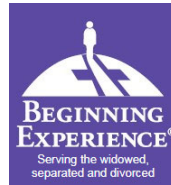

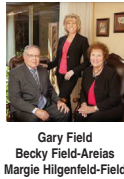
