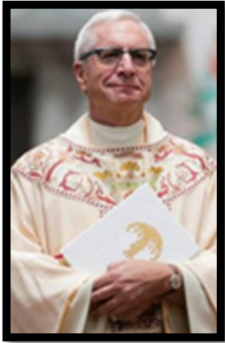

“Ja ever” sit and sort out the basics of our faith? What is essential and what is negotiable? It certainly seems as though it’s ALL up-for-grabs” – but it isn’t. What is essential is to be connected; connected to Jesus Christ who is the Divine Son of God, to be connected to Jesus Christ the Divine Son of God in the Holy Eucharist, and to be connected to the community which is the Body of Christ who is the Divine Son of God. Connected to life, connected to the love of God – we are branches. Jesus, who forgives sins and promises eternal life is the reason we gather in faith. We gather to pursue holiness.

We pursue holiness by extending the mission of Jesus, salvation, to others. Are you a joyful, (is it sometimes written joy-filled) Christian? Do the promises of Christ bring joy that others can see? Does your life encourage others – do you evangelize; by the way you live, do you spread the Good News of Jesus? Nifty questions.

Today the Lord encourages us to “cut off and burn” simply, get rid of that which prevents live-giving growth in each of us, in our parish community, and in our Church generally.

In his writings, homilies, and the example of his life, Pope Francis is an example of a joy-filled Catholic Christian. At least I find him to be so.

Here’s a point. Our parish welcomed new members at Easter. Members of our parish received First Holy Communion over the past two Saturdays, still more members will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on May 4 and adults on May 20. All of the baptized are encouraged to be holy, filled with the “Spirit of Adoption” as God’s sons and daughters, sisters and brothers of Jesus Our Lord. Do we encourage one another adequately? Do we “lend a hand” with worship – as ministers and as participants? Is there a ministry you can join? Have you participated in the PSA Campaign for the Diocese of Orange and our parish yet? The Early Church as we read of it in the Acts of the Apostles went for Jesus and his promises full throttle. Some went to unspeakable deaths, martyred rather than deny or turn back. Many who didn’t believe were converted and spread the Good News because of the love they experienced in their conversion. Let’s not say: “All of that happened a long time ago and in a far-away land” – together make holiness happen here, today. Jesus continues to give life to his branches. We are the branches, let us live.

Below are some sections from Pope Francis’ Exhortation – *Rejoice and Be Glad*. I underlined a section of #141- he mentioned us, the Servites.

7. I like to contemplate the holiness present in the patience of God’s people: in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families, in the sick, in elderly religious who never lose their smile. In their daily perseverance I see the holiness of the Church militant. Very often it is a holiness found in our next-door neighbors, those who, living in our midst, reflect God’s presence. We might call them “the middle class of holiness”.

14. To be holy does not require being a bishop, a priest or a religious. We are frequently tempted to think that holiness is only for those who can withdraw from ordinary affairs to spend much time in prayer. That is not the case. We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves. Are you called to the consecrated life? Be holy by living out your commitment with joy. Are you married? Be holy by loving and caring for your husband or wife, as Christ does for the Church. Do you work for a living? Be holy by laboring with integrity and skill in the service of your brothers and sisters. Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching the little ones how to follow Jesus. Are you in a position of authority? Be holy by working for the common good and renouncing personal gain. [14]

139. Let us ask the Lord for the grace not to hesitate when the Spirit calls us to take a step forward. Let us ask for the apostolic courage to share the Gospel with others and to stop trying to make our Christian life a museum of memories. In every situation, may the Holy Spirit cause us to contemplate history in the light of the risen Jesus. In this way, the Church will not stand still, but constantly welcome the Lord’s surprises.

141. Growth in holiness is a journey in community, side by side with others. We see this in some holy communities. From time to time, the Church has canonized entire communities that lived the Gospel heroically or offered to God the lives of all their members. We can think, for example, of the seven holy founders of the Order of the Servants of Mary, the seven blessed sisters of the first monastery of the Visitation in Madrid, the Japanese martyrs Saint Paul Miki and companions, the Korean martyrs Saint Andrew Taegon and companions, or the South American martyrs Saint Roque González, Saint Alonso Rodríguez and companions. We should also remember the more recent witness borne by the Trappists of Tibhirine, Algeria, who prepared as a community for martyrdom. In many holy marriages too, each spouse becomes a means used by Christ for the sanctification of the other. Living or working alongside others is surely a path of spiritual growth. Saint John of the Cross told one of his followers: “You are living with others in order to be fashioned and tried”. [104]

143. Such experiences, however, are neither the most frequent nor the most important. The common life, whether in the family, the parish, the religious community or any other, is made up of small everyday things. This was true of the holy community formed by Jesus, Mary and Joseph, which reflected in an exemplary way the beauty of the Trinitarian communion. It was also true of the life that Jesus shared with his disciples and with ordinary people.

145. A community that cherishes the little details of love, [107] whose members care for one another and create an open and evangelizing environment, is a place where the risen Lord is present, sanctifying it in accordance with the Father’s plan.
