A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M



I wonder about people who are like the self-righteous Pharisee: “I give you thanks, O God, that I am not like the rest of humanity –wanting goods, crooked, who give an uncomfortable amorous look toward others with ogling eyes. I tithed to my church, speak the truth, and am chaste.” Yes, that describes the Pharisee. They are also drained of joy and they drain the joy out of other people. Their self-aggrandizing pride gets in their way. Being “Me first, even me only” they do not even depend on God.

Such an attitude is the heresy of Pelagianism, which means we have to haul ourselves into righteousness by our own bootstraps. Pelagianism is, hands down, the winningest heresy in the history of humankind. It thrived long before there was a Church. In fact, Pelagianism is the Original Sin: “Who needs God? I’ll eat this and be equal to God. I can do it alone.”

How can such an attitude be wrong? Isn’t this the self-improvement section of the bookstore? Look at all **I** can do to help **ME** be a better version of **MYSELF**. Wasn’t I told: “**I** can do it” so “**I** did it”?

Does that sound like a lonely life to you? Pelagianism isn’t merely the conviction that “I can go it alone,” but that “I **must** go it alone--because I am alone.” The saddest Pelagians are those who think the whole world is on their shoulders, and--not being Atlases--they stagger on, valiantly, stupidly, nobly, self-righteously, self-destructively.

The faithful person knows he/she doesn’t go at life alone, because he/she is never alone. Today’s Gospel lesson teaches: Humble yourself to recognize that when your work begins with prayer, it continues with prayer. It begins with God who draws us closer to Him and helps us complete His will, His plan for us. Do God’s work, *opus Dei*.

A very wise spiritual director gives out this prayer: “God, make me honest enough to admit I need your help, and humble enough to accept it.”

It takes humility.



It saddens me to tell you that Fr. Jerry Horan, OSM – who leads us in weekday Mass, some weekend help and on Good Friday - suffered a stroke in Rome while attending the General Chapter of the Servite Order. He is making steady progress to recover. As I write, he is in a healing hospital and with good progress he will be moved to a rehab facility, in Rome. It is uncertain when he will return to the United States. What is certain is that your prayer will help his recovery. Please remember Fr. Jerry Horan in your prayers.

provides funding for academic scholarships at The Catholic University of America in Washington, DC in response to the commitment made by the bishops at its foundation in 1887. Catholic University is the only United States University with Pontifical faculties. Students are enrolled from all 50 states and almost 100 countries.

4.) Catholic Home Missions

Nearly half of our country is considered home mission territory.

This appeal helps our Catholic neighbors here in the United States who do not have access to basic pastoral services like Mass, the sacraments, and faith formation. Through your support, the Catholic Home Missions Appeal helps these mission dioceses form vibrant faith communities and strengthens the Church at home.
