




THE PARISH AS ONE BODY

Essentially Christianity is about dying and rising. The Christian project can be summarized by "dying to old ways and rising to new life." Isn't that what this "season of grace" – Lent – puts before each one of us: Die to old ways, to the old self so that you will LIVE into everlasting LIFE. Put away what is not part of being in and of Christ. Put on Christ. Clothe yourself in Christ. Live with and for Christ alone.



This Lent what will you die from so that on Easter you will rise to or toward? Is it a new relationship with Jesus Christ? Is the act of Lent giving up Ketel One, See's Candy, or not saying any word worse than aardvark? It is the decision you make to live for Jesus and imitate him by living his command to love one another? Concentrate on and celebrate the many good things you do and ask God to guide you to greater goodness, happiness, and holiness. Pray the timeless but evermore meaningful hymn #339 in our books: "We rise again from ashes from the good we've failed to do. We rise again from ashes to create ourselves anew. If all our world is ashes, then must our lives be

true, an offering of ashes, an offering to you...." It's ourselves, an offering we make to God because we love Him.

Being a Christian is an intentional decision. It is the intentional decision to live so as to imitate the person of Jesus, extending his love to our neighbor, a relationship with his Father to all people. It is the intentional decision to love. It's the decision that is made to turn away from selfishness and turn toward another person, as Jesus did – with love. And that's done so you both shall live.

A VERY DIFFICULT lesson to teach, including to Catholic school students, is that love is an act of the will. Love is a decision you make to serve, a decision to take responsibility for other people. Love is not infatuation, it is not romance, certainly it is not "having sex." Love is the way you serve. To remind us of love, the body of Christ is on every Catholic crucifix. "I'm all used up for you. That's how much I love you. Won't you love others as I love you? Won't you serve others as I serve you?"

Lent is a good time to prune what isn't growing to allow for new, rich, and abundant growth.

What we do as individual disciples of Jesus becomes our action as a community of believers. Our purpose as a community is to advance the ministry, love, of Jesus to others. We aren't a secular community living human life, but a Christian community living Jesus among us. "Do our parish activities reflect the vison and mission of the Parish and the charism of St. Juliana?" Is Jesus the center of this activity? The answers give direction, vision, and a view to new life.

What can we do, as the St. Juliana Community, to become intentional disciples of Jesus, form a habit during this Lent to be life-giving and life-long?

Here are some suggestions:

Attend Eucharistic Exposition especially the inconvenient hours. Attend as a family.

Attend faith formation opportunities, if appropriate, as a family.

Support the parish intentionally, phone Curtis Wesseln (714.869.3829) for information.

Intentionally serve the parish, be part of the liturgical ministries (altar servers, ushers (ministers of hospitality) readers, Eucharistic ministers), prayer groups (Tuesday rosary), and service groups (St. Vincent DePaul, bereavement).

Ask to volunteer in the parish. Call Esteban Jimenez (714.853.1191) business manager, for information.

Encourage "estranged Catholics" to return to the Church – talk to your neighbors about faith. Be a good neighbor, an example of Jesus among us.

Drive carefully in the parking lot. Observe entrance and exit signs.

Hold the doors open for others to enter or exit. Talk to the people entering or leaving with you.

Welcome all who enter our doors, meet and know members of our community.

Help a parish in need, I suggest St. Anthony Claret in Anaheim west of Acacia on La Palma.



in our lives, or do we spend some time in the presence of the Lord? Many of us experienced Centering Prayer for the first time to just allow ourselves to be available to the Lord.


