

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

I've substituted this for another topic I wrote. Regarding Kobe, I'm speechless. Read my inarticulation.

Sister told us – the 'triangular box' high in the left corner of the classroom was an 'ear'. Well, it looked like an ear – or a mouth. An old piece of cloth covered a woodcut-out that looked like a face with big ears or two eyes and a mouth. Ha, it's not Rorschach! We were told that all the noise we made in the classroom was listened to by Sister Principal who would come and correct us. Then on Friday, November 22, 1963 it (the 'triangle box') spoke: "President Kennedy has been shot and is mortally wounded in Dallas, Texas. All teachers are to take their students to the chapel." I understood shot, I hadn't a clue as to what "mortally wounded" meant. It was terrible, we moved quickly and the adults were crying. We prayed the rosary. Then we marched into a big room were televisions were on pillars. Walter Cronkite gave the announcement. His voice cracked. Adults cried. Flags were lowered, bugles played "Taps". In huge headlines, the newspaper headlines blared JFK DEAD. Television coverage didn't end. The accused assassin was himself killed live on national television. What a mess. I still tear up. Raw emotions and shock. A young life ended.

That young and beautiful widowed woman and children left without a dad.

C.S. Lewis died that same day, November 22, 1963. A footnote on the obituary page. Noted without emotion.

St. Catherine's served us a hot lunch in the "Mess Hall" every day. Every now and again Major Schmitt made an announcement. On December 15, 1966, he said something like: "Walt Disney, one of your heroes died early today." We paused. I once saw Walt Disney at Disneyland. News headlines were pretty big. No flag lowering and no bugles. Instead, a sad Mickey Mouse.

In time Martin Luther King Jr. and Robert Kennedy were shot dead. St Francis Albert Sinatra, Groucho Marx, Charles Schultz, Shelley Berman, and other inspiring celebrities died naturally. John Belushi, Robin Williams, and others committed suicide. Michael Jackson died a strange death. Astronauts died in disasters. The Space Shuttle Challenger disaster was January 28, 1986. The headlines for each of them varied. Obituaries were informative. Sometimes the flag was lowered with bugles. The death of someone whose career brightened the day naturally brings sadness. Deaths leave holes. We love these folks.

Among athletes, Roberto Clemente whom I admire was killed in a tragic plane accident on New Year's Eve 1972 while bringing food to people in Nicaragua. Following his death, rules for admission to the Baseball Hall of Fame were changed. Major League Baseball gives an annual award in his honor. Never a Pirates fan, I thought Clemente was the real deal. He has not been replaced.

Now Kobe Bryant. For many young people, his is the first death that is close to home – in space, time, and faith. He was one of us. He played his entire career just up the freeway from here. He lived just down the freeway from here. Perhaps we saw him casually. We certainly watched him on the television. We knew him as an amazing and inspiring athlete. We encountered him, although very public we barely knew him. His life was complex, as a team player and husband his life was marked with difficulties. He was a Catholic who went to Mass even on the morning of his death. Reports say that he was at Mass before he played his final game. Psst: he was often at Mass. He attended the parish Bible study.

Last Sunday it wasn't Kobe alone, nine people perished. Parents, children, family. Gulp. That's really sad. They were young. They had futures yet to live. Media won't let the survivors forget our admiration.

My Dad was killed in an accident on July 5, 1964, age forty-five. Just a row or two from my parents' graves is a row of graves of the Traxler family. Nine family members were all killed in an accident at the same time, July 1964. I stop there every time I'm at Holy Sepulcher Cemetery. The memory of that row of fresh graves. Yikes!

Life has quality that goes beyond what we think of as achievement or celebrity status. Since last Sunday many social media posts have carried imperatives directing readers how to live. Don't be a victim of success unlimited. Included among the many posts is the fact that Kobe was a practicing Catholic.

Kobe found Jesus' own imperative, "Come and See" as an invitation he accepted. He encountered Jesus. He loved the Jesus he encountered. He was at Our Lady Queen of the Angels and St. Edwards Parishes frequently. Faith in God has something to offer whatever we mean by "human fulfillment."

The tragic helicopter crash seems so Hollywood. The Mamba Mentality, certainly Hollywood. Church attendance is not mainstream and raises the God question, which is the most important question anyone will ever answer. He wasn't just another victim of the American Dream. What are humans made for? The answer is God. How did Kobe know that? Come and See! Encounter Jesus.

50 WEEKS OF PRAYER





Restorative Justice seeks to help heal the relational harm caused by crime and violence that includes providing caring support for those suffering such a tragic loss.




