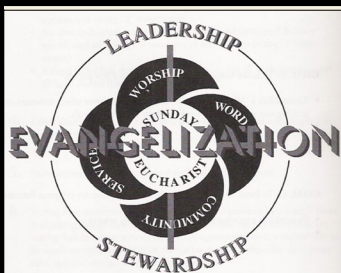

A NOTE FROM FR. MIKE PONTARELLI, O.S.M

Knowledge of God is childish for some people. It continues as the undeveloped recitation of stuff learned long ago. When such people talk about God I wonder why their theology, the study of God, never matured. A great deal of the God answers were learned in school when there was neither interest nor concern. The child-like are a different breed from the childish. The child-like are joyful, curious, and docile. They want to develop an understanding of the world around them. They ask questions and listen to answers. To understand at a deeper level, they question some more.

Discuss around your table: “How have you – each one around the table – changed your image of God since grammar school or Confirmation? How has your relationship with God changed since youth?”

Is God yet small, even destructive? Is that why God isn't discussed? He is not God! God is a policeman hiding and ready to pounce on me when I do wrong. He's a stage-manager and I am a puppet. He's a light-switch. I can turn him on when I need him, off when not necessary. There are many other inappropriate descriptions of something called “god”. They are not God. (refer to:

Philips, J.B., **Your God is Too Small**. N.Y, N.Y. Macmillan Publishing, 1961).

This is the Age of Science! We cannot accept a truth without proof and sufficient understanding. Faith in God means accepting something without proof or enough understanding that I can speak about God intelligently. I can explain “lift” the force by which an airplane takes off. I can't explain the “force” called God. So, away with God. Psst: God is not a force.

Unfortunately, many people believe that theology, is such a soft science that God is whatever a speaker wants him to be. Some people claim, quite incorrectly, that theology is nothing more than an opinion and opinions cannot be wrong. It's the don't bother me with the facts, my mind is made up stance.

Have you heard an argument like this: My God is my God; your God is your God. Make fun of my God the crutch and I will mock your God “the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.” God is my opinion and I have a right to my opinion.

Has your opinion ever been wrong? Pedestrian opinions can be lethal! Your opinion on cancer is not as good as the studied position of an oncologist. A golf pro's opinion of your playing will change the way you play golf. Believing his opinion, you will act on it. (Belief is reflected by action.) Especially if he is paid! Likewise, your opinion about God and His church is not as valid as that of a theologian.

You certainly have a right to your opinion. That opinion does not create a fact. Your opinion is only as good as the supporting evidence for it. The evidence comes from the subject itself. God is not a personal construct.

The decision on the existence of God is certainly yours. However, it's not a question of “Do you want God to exist.” Here's the point, No matter how strong your belief, you cannot make something real cease to exist. Psst: you can't see gravity. When you see a lead ingot falling, don't stand under it. You can't see electricity but you will feel it if you stick your fingers into the light socket. Point to love. Love, not a ring or children or the dinner tab on February 14th. Point to love.

How will you know the existence of God? How will you form a relationship with God? As it is with anything or anyone, you'll have to “Come and See”.

Are you willing to be a seeker? Whom, how, and where do you seek? What difference will the search make in your life?

MORE ASH WEDNESDAY THOUGHTS...

Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving: these disciplines, prescribed by Jesus himself in the Sermon on the Mount, along with strict instructions not to flaunt them in public to win recognition and praise (Matthew 6:1-18), have been embraced by all the saints at the beginning of every Lent for almost two thousand years. But mention Lent, and many react with a grimace or slight shudder—even now, years after official obligations have been reduced to a minimum! No wonder the Eastern Rite's "Lenten Announcement" sounds surprising: "Let us receive with joy, O faithful people, the divinely inspired announcement of Lent! The Lenten Spring shines forth! Begin the fast with joy! Let us fast from passions as well as food, taking pleasure in the good works of the Spirit, and accomplishing them in love!" Saint John Chrysostom, whose feast is September 13, elaborates: "Do you fast? Give proof by your works. If you see a poor person, take pity. An enemy, be reconciled. The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday, February 26, 2020 and ends with the beginning of the Easter Triduum and the celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 9, 2020.

In a particular way during Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to the spiritual and corporal works of mercy that "remind us that faith finds expression in concrete everyday actions meant to help our neighbors in body and spirit."

The following practices are to be observed by Catholics in the Diocese of Orange in their penitential practices:

Fasting and Abstinence

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, a priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday, Feb. 26, 2020 and Good Friday, Apr. 10, 2020 are days of *fast and abstinence*.
All the Fridays of Lent are days of *abstinence*.

Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving

are the three traditional disciplines of Lent.

The faithful should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and renewal of baptism at Easter.

The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man.

The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation.

The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station.

At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete.

Everyone is encouraged to attend.

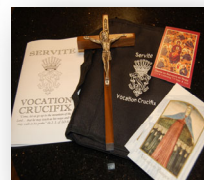

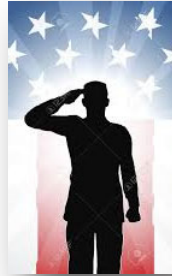
